

Being the modest man he is, Stuart deliberately asked for no fuss to be made over his departure, but I'm sure the whole village would like to join

the PPC in thanking him for his years of dedication, leadership and musicianship. Stuart is a superb musician; an excellent organist and also a fantastic singer - who will quickly forget his beautiful and heartfelt rendition of 'Where you there when they crucified my Lord' during the Easter service. He has also been key to the organisation of many of the wonderful services in Holy Cross Church, particularly the Christmas Services of Nine Lessons and Carols, the Crib Service and the beautiful and prayerful Good Friday Tenebrae Service.

He will be sadly missed, especially by the less than Angelic members of the choir, who have enjoyed every minute of his rehearsals. We marvelled at the way he managed to extract some passably musical sounds out of his motley crew, (often by singing every part himself, from the low bass to the highest notes of the sopranos), and basked in his fulsome praise after each performance ("Well, I think we got away with it - did you spot anyone grimacing?")

So thank you, Stuart, for everything you have done for Avening - and a warm welcome to Colin and Theo, who will together be taking over the task of Avening organist (yes, it took two to replace you, Stuart!)



Avening Church Music

A Brief History

Legend has it that before the mid 1850's, music in the church was provided by a Flute, Clarinet, Violin and Cello. Prior to that, music was only available from the human voice. We do not know who these later musicians were.

In 1860, Mr Robert Walker, who rented Avening Court from the Playne family, presented to the church a harmonium costing £30. Mr Walker, described in the 1861 census as a Landed Proprietor and Holder was born in London around 1782 and died on the 16th of March 1866. His daughter, Mrs Jane Rawlinson was, for many years, choir mistress and organist in Avening.

After about ten years, the harmonium was decreed insufficient and the two Sunday School teachers, Miss Annie Cox and Miss Rhoda Coates undertook to raise funds for a better instrument. Assisted by Mr John Davies, who had lately moved into the Old Rectory, they raised £60 in house to house collections and a new organ was installed around 1875.

This was a wind-driven instrument and had to be hand-pumped, usually by younger boys from the congregation. A tube containing a float gave indication as to when more pressure was required. It was installed across the entrance



to the South Transept and the space behind it used for a church museum.

The Company in charge of the building of the organ was Liddiatt and Sons of Leonard Stanley. They bought in the necessary parts required from a Company in Belgium. In 1901 Liddiatts were asked to refurbish the organ.

Sometime in the early 1950's, George Osmond and Co. of Taunton was invited to carry out further improvements, one of which was to replace the hand-operated bellow pump with an electrically driven one. Exit left the need for the choir's younger member operators!!

Those later pumpers included Jim Hill, Jim Parsons, Don Hopes and Riley Vincent.

The later organists were Alfred Morris, the schools headmaster, Roy Cudmore, Jack Harvey and the last, Stuart Walkley.

In early 1997, the question of a replacement organ was raised during a PCC meeting when, following an inspection by a diocesan adviser, it was declared that our old friend was wrongly positioned and now difficult to maintain. Funds were limited at the time, with major modifications being under way to the Brydges Aisle and further expenditure anticipated for the Millennium Cross and it wasn't until 2001 that discussions were reopened in the PCC meetings.

Over the coming months, these discussions continued including a trial of a new digital organ, with an eventual acceptance that Avening church would lose a much-valued old friend but it would be replaced by a modern electronic instrument. This was installed at the west end of the nave in mid-2002, with speakers placed strategically to bring the sound to every part of the church.

More discussions followed concerning the fate of the organ pipes and, in the end, these were bought by the parishioners as mementoes of 'days of yore'. It would be interesting to learn what people did with these pipes. Are they now a talking point, on display or are they mostly deep in many Avening attics?

THE 'APPRENTICE' COMES TO AVENING!

Whilst you could never compare her to Sir Alan Sugar, Avening Primary School headteacher Jane Rushton has had a taste of what it's like to be on TV show The Apprentice during April.

The Hawks class (Year 3 and 4) ventured into the world of business with the aim of raising funds for the school and the Friends of Avening School (FOAS). The 'Enterprise' project has seen the pupils apply several elements of their curriculum learning to the development of a business plan.



Hawks class teacher Mark "This Wilkinson says: project will be a fantastic opportunity for the children to put their learning in all areas of the curriculum into practice. They are continually building on their previous knowledge want to learn new skills to help them solve the many challenges of running business."

The plan was presented to Mrs Rushton through a video and powerpoint production involving all the pupils in that class. Its goal was to secure a loan to buy seeds to grow vegetables and herbs to sell at the FOAS summer fair in July. The plan contained all the key elements:

- Aims (to raise funds for school/FOAS)
- Vision (to grow herbs and vegetables in time to sell them at the FOAS fair in July)
- Health and Safety (eg always have an adult present when gardening)
- Market Research (questionnaire sent home via all pupils)
- Customers (the school cook, and various staff members)

- Competitors (Tesco, Bramleys etc)
- 'Our edge' (we are local you know where the products are coming from)
- Sales and marketing (posters)
- Finance (loan from Mrs Rushton/ getting pricing right)
- Risks (the weather)

The class were successful in their bid for a business loan and have been busy propagating the seeds in the school garden. Mrs Rushton commented:

"The Hawks have really impressed me with their teamwork and multimedia presentation. I am sure we have some budding entrepreneurs among them and I look forward to seeing how their 'business' develops."

Two of the pupils commented:

"Business can be quite hard. It is a lot of work." - Olivia

"On the 13th of July the Hawks are making a Healthy Hawks Vegetable stall for the summer fete. We are raising money for FOAS. I am looking forward to selling all of the vegetables we have grown." - *Greta*.







Jitterbug Perfume – Tom Robbins

So, this is the storyline. 8th century Alobar, a tribal leader in ancient Bohemia, dodges death at the hands of his own people, as is their custom after showing the first signs of aging. After fleeing he must live a simple travelling life as a peasant. He travels through Eurasia and meets the goatgod Pan, who is losing his powers as that part of the world turns toward Christianity. In India, he meets Kudra, who goes on to become his wife for hundreds of years. Their unfading, impassioned love is like something from a fairy tale albeit an adult one. An experiment with transcendental meditation separates them in the 17th century and they are unable to reunite until the present day.

Meanwhile, in the present-day, Priscilla is an amateur perfumer trying to locate an elusive base note from a fragrance. While attempting this, she contemplates the mysterious beets that keep being delivered to her apartment. "The beet is the most intense of vegetables. The radish, admittedly, is more feverish, but the fire of the radish is a cold fire, the fire of discontent not of passion. Tomatoes are lusty enough, yet there runs through tomatoes an undercurrent of frivolity. Beets are deadly serious." In New Orleans, Priscilla's stepmother, Madame Devalier, is also working to recreate the same fragrance. Bingo Pajama also features as a mysterious supplier of Jamaican jasmine as he is followed by a swarm of bees.

The cast is as eccentric as the story is quirky. Robbins is an unconventional writer who has a loyal cult following. I would however, hesitate to recommend this novel beyond the twenty something reader. For two of the members this was a second reading of the novel and both found that it held more allure on first reading a couple of decades ago. This led the group to discuss the idea of novels and how they can be read differently at different stages of life. This was a slightly poignant realisation in some ways. The group welcomed Alex, a new member who first read about our group in Switzerland!
