

Avening Memorial Hall Update

You may have noticed that the Hall has had its ageing windows replaced. These are identical copies of the old windows, but with modern triple glazing and security locks. The Managing Committee hopes that you will not see anything different, but appreciate that these new windows represent another significant improvement to the Hall: warmer in the winter, cooler in the summer, significantly reduced heating bills (the single biggest annual outlay for the Hall each year). The works have also included the installation of new gates to the side entrance. We hope you will agree that the Hall is now in great shape.

Since we last reported on the Hall's progress we have reached final agreement with the Gloucester County Council on the long terms leasing of the Hall to the School under fair and equitable terms. Whilst the legal documentation is yet to be signed, the major commercial arrangements are now settled.

The arrangement should secure the financial future of the Hall and ensure the Hall is maintained to a good standard well into the future. It also then allows the committee to focus on fund-raising and explaining the benefits of the Hall to Parishioners. We have now three regular evening users and the weekend and party bookings are significantly higher in 2010 than in 2009. The Hall is a fantastic village resource and is there for you.

I would also like to thank Gill Parsons and Jo Skillen who have recently

resigned from the committee. Without their support, expertise and hard work we would not have made so much progress. Also Sharn Lyte who, whilst remaining on the Committee, has stepped down as our treasurer. Without Sharn the Hall would have fallen into darkness on several occasions.

The Committee is always seeking new people to join. Our AGM is in June/July and will be well advertised in advance.

A Little More Avening History

Francis de Paravicini

Vicar of Holy Cross Church, Avening (1856 to 1894)

Writing in the Parish Magazine "Home Works", published on the 1st February 1889, Francis takes up the subject of attendance at Avening Village School.

He talks about the benefits of education to all children and of the interest shown by parents to the children at home. He writes:

"....and home education, in your example and training, is as necessary to the formation of your children's minds and characters as is the teaching of the school to their acquisition of knowledge. Indeed, on your example and home influence may depend the success and failure of your children in the school and in their later life. When parents are, unhappily, indifferent to the training and education of their children, we too often see those children grow up in ignorance and disobedience, which too frequently ends in vice and misery"

No changes there then!

He goes on: "To those of you who have exercised this necessary home influence, through your example and training, it will be a satisfaction to read the following record of your children's exemplary attendance during the past three months at school. During those three months the school has been open 99 times. The following list gives the names of children who were most regular in attendance:-

William May, Frederick and Annie Barnes, Matthew Nunam attended 99 times

George May and Minnie Luker attended 98 times Annie Hill and Constance Ludlow attended 86 times James Fletcher and Julia Ind attended 95 times."

He lists others of a high attendance and says how satisfactory these numbers are. However, he continues:

"In contrast to these cases of exemplary attendances I regret to have to put before you twelve other children, whose negligent and irregular

attendances mark sufficient bad examples to be censured. They are the following twelve children, viz:-

He goes on to "name names" and there the page runs out.

Among them, though, is one Beatrice Luker, sister of Minnie Luker mentioned above. At the time, both girls lived with their parents at the top of the High Street, Minnie aged 8 and Beatrice being two years older and they had three younger siblings. Mother Gemma Luker was, in the 1891 census, listed as a tailoress so perhaps Minnie was kept at home to support her mother.

I wonder if Francis took all this into account before writing his piece?

Do I hear the Reverend Celia sharpening her pencil?!!

To be continued with tales of deception, fraud and theft.....





Avening Roll of Honour No. 25

Samuel Luker

Private: 4th Battalion Gloster Regiment

Nags Head on Wednesday the 9th of August 1876, saw the birth of Sam Luker. His father, William Luker (1822 - 1889) had been married twice. His first wife, being a widow, came with a child from her first marriage and bore him at least three further children before passing away in 1871 and his second wife, Hester had also been married and came with a further three children from her first marriage. Her maiden name was Uzzell and she was the daughter of Emanuel Uzzell of Oaksey. She had married an Ind (not from Avening) and it was from this union that her first three children came. She was widowed in the 1860's and married William at Holy Cross Church, Avening on Saturday the 4th of April 1874. Sam's elder brother, John was born in 1875 and two sisters followed in 1881 and 1883. All four were baptised in Avening, Sam being welcomed into the Church on Christmas Day 1878.

In his early working life he was a groom but on the 11th of January 1896, aged 19, he joined the Gloucestershire Regiment. At that time he was 5 feet 6 inches tall (1.67m) and weighed 133 pounds (60.3 kgs) with a chest measurement of 34 inches (86 cms) expanded to 36 inches (91 cms) - not a big man.

He spent the first year of service in the UK but on the 13th of January 1897 set sail with his battalion for India where he remained until January 1904. During that time he served in Calcutta, Darjeeling and Allalabad. It was during this time that he suffered from malaria but appeared to recover. He remained with the Glosters until completion of his engagement in January 1912.

He married Emily Rhoda Frape at Rodmarton on Saturday the 2nd of June 1906 and he and his new wife settled in 47 Castle Street, Cirencester. The couple were blessed with five children, four girls and a boy, born between 1906 and 1912. On entering civilian life, Sam took up labouring and worked in a number of different companies in Cirencester.

He volunteered for more military service in December 1915 and returned to the Glosters after a short Reserve engagement in June 1916. Shortly after his malaria reoccurred, this being followed by a persistent cough

and loss of weight. He was admitted to Colchester Hospital in August 1916 and pulmonary tuberculosis was diagnosed, said to

have been caused by his military service. He was discharged from the service in September 1916 and returned home to Cirencester. After visits to various Medical Boards he was awarded a military pension at Chisledon Camp in February 1917. Sam worked as a labourer during the latter part of 1917 but he died of TB on Thursday, 2nd of May, 1918 at the Workhouse Infirmary, Cirencester. He was buried at Chesterton Cemetery some days later. He was 41 years old and left Emily with the four children but so far, we have been unable to locate

any descendants. He remembered with Honour on several War Memorials in Cirencester and plans are afoot to add him to the Avening Roll of Honour in Avening Church.

Avening Youth Club

Since October 2009, Avening Youth Club has been run by Cassie and Leonie, two young Mums from the village, with some support from the youth organisation, Young Gloucestershire. Their first task was to clear out the old, broken and abused paraphernalia from the hall and then they bought new equipment, including a new television, an ipod, a new stereo system and lots of arts and crafts materials.

The regular routine for a Youth Club evening includes activities such as pool, table tennis, card games and dominoes in the Chamberlin room, with music, dancing and chat in the main hall from opening at 6pm. For the last half hour there are group games like hockey, football, dodge ball, basketball, etc. to get rid of some excess energy before the club closes at 8pm. The children's birthdays are celebrated with a cake and party games. The club also has the best tuck shop in Avening, selling sell sweets, chocolate and crisps!

In addition to these regular activities, however, every month the children decide what other things they want to do, which have included candle making, hama beads, sewing, cooking and painting. Some other entertainments they have recently enjoyed include 'I'm a celebrity get me out of here', a Christmas disco, a talk by the local Police and an introduction to the healthy eating with Young Gloucestershire.

The monthly planner gets displayed in the hall, outside the school and now in the Villager for anyone interested in joining (see page 28). Among the things planned for the next few months are face painting, a fire engine visit, summer disco, football skills training and outdoor activities in the playing field.

The Club recently received a grant from the Youth Opportunity Fund (part of Young Gloucestershire) which was used for new games equipment, including badminton nets, basket ball hoops, giant connect four, indoor cricket stumps, new hockey sticks and rounder's equipment. It also received a grant from Avening Parish Council, which was used to purchase a Wii gaming console, including games and controllers. The children applied for this and were very excited when it was awarded, and the Wii is now available every Tuesday.

Cassie and Leonie are both police checked and qualified to run the club in a professional manner. Any profit the Youth Club makes is put back into it by way of art materials and new equipment. They run the Club in a carefree, fun way which shows in the increase of numbers and in the fact the children all come back week after week. They are happy to represent the Club on village committees in order to give the children of Avening a voice.



Numbers have increased from 10-15 to over 20 a week in 5 months. The children (and staff) arrive and leave smiling, everyone has great fun and the parents have given great support and positive feedback.

The main aim for the future is to increase the number of children who attend the Youth Club, and to carry on entertaining them and keeping them off the streets. They work closely with the school, engaging in school projects, for example, and hope to be more involved in the parish by getting the children grouped together to help with the village clean-ups. They could help the playing field committee do fund raising. And they would love a stall at the Church fete to sell their art work or do their own games. Finally, one day, they may be able to open the doors a second week night!!!!

Play Ranger Holiday Sessions in Avening



Summary

Over the past year we have seen some positive results in Avening with overall crime falling from 39 incidents to 23 a 41% reduction and follows on from a strong reduction from 2007/08.

The main areas of success have come with the reduction in criminal damage down 41% and Theft down 58%, Crimes of which impact heavily on those who suffer loss and the local residents.

We would like to thank all the support received from the Parish Council, local groups and most importantly the residents in helping us bring Crime down in Avening by such a margin and look forward to continuing to work with you in the future.




