For them to hear that Churches all over the Country are full on Sunday 11th of November, most specifically to remember them, and to pray for their safe return, will bring them encouragement and comfort.

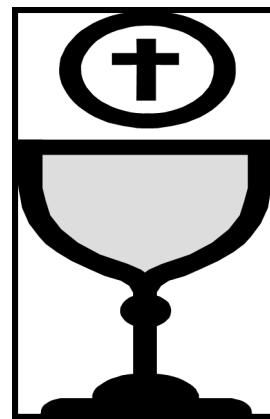
The Church Service starts at 10.50am

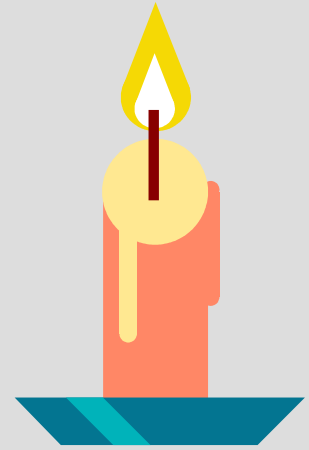

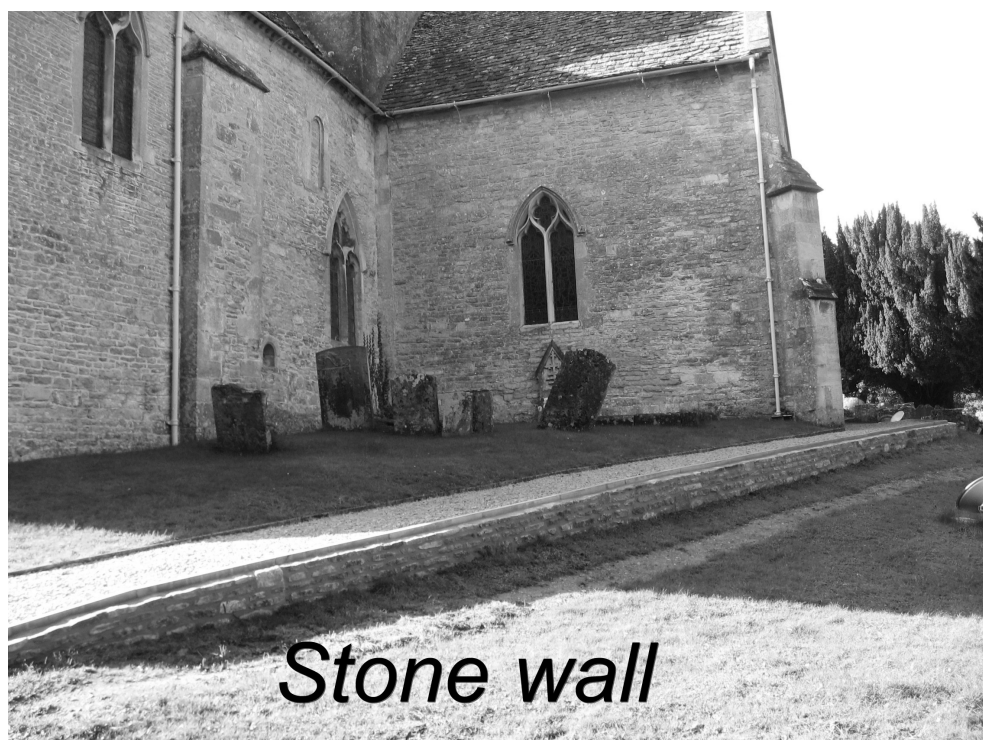
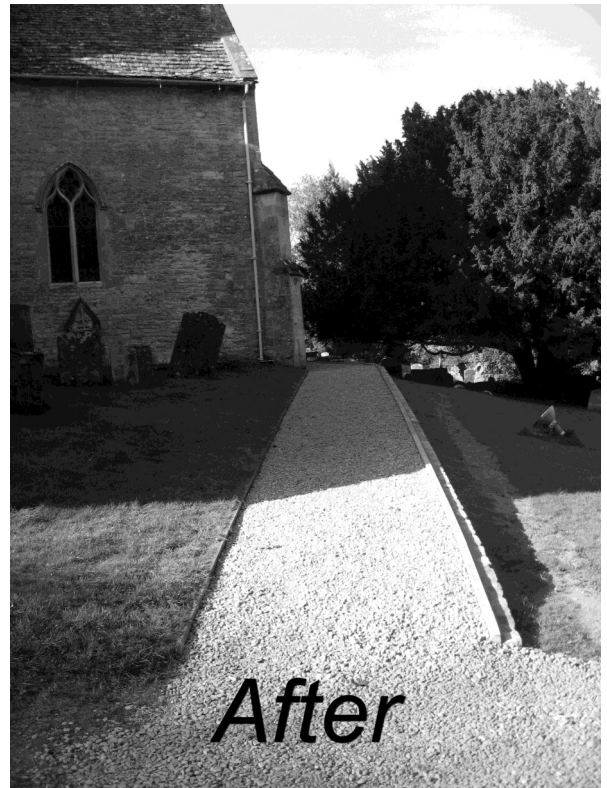

Avening's Roll of Honour

I have always been impressed by the way the Remembrance Service is performed at Avening Church and have found the reading of the names from the memorial particularly moving.

In transcribing the census returns for the village, it became evident that we know so little about any of those named on our memorial and I thought it may be fitting to get a bit more detail on their lives and family so that we can have more understanding of how they fitted into the village.

I quickly learnt how the names are presented on our two memorial stones. Those who died in the first World War are listed by the date of their death. Those of the second World War are listed alphabetically.

I hope to produce a small life history for each casualty and will publish in the "Villager" my findings at the rate of one per month. This month I am pleased to include the history of Frederick Pollock, our first loss in WW1.

Here is where you can help. Are you related to any of those mentioned on our War Memorial or do you know the whereabouts of any person who is?

Next month I hope to report on Frederick James Fletcher and, later, William C Richings. Please let me know of any detail that may help my research. I can also pass on any paperwork I acquire to any members of those families.

I hope this information will help define the use of the phrase "Lest We Forget"

From the Avening Roll of Honour

FREDERICK ROBERT POLLOCK

Frederick Robert Pollock was born on the 24th of October 1885 at 74 Queens Gate, Kensington, West London. He was the eldest son of Robert Erskine Pollock, an eminent barrister (later KC) and Mary Viner Pollock (née Playne).

Mary was the daughter of Frederick Carl Playne (whose birth was registered in the Stroud District in 1837) a professional soldier, a captain in the Rifle Brigade. He died in 1864 in Canada, where Mary, his only child was born just three months earlier. Frederick Carl Playne owned the Avening Court estate and Mary inherited this from her father.

Avening Court was rented by the Hopkinson family up to the early 1880's but it was after Robert Pollock's marriage to Mary in 1884 and with the birth of their two sons in 1885 and 1888 that they took up an interest in the estate, sharing their time between Avening and West London. The whole family were "visitors" at Shrewsbury, Shropshire at the time of 1891 census, Avening Court and it's Lower Lodge being recorded as 'unoccupied'.

At the time of the 1901 census, Frederick was at Eton College which he had entered in 1899 and remained there until Christmas 1903. He immediately entered the Military College, Sandhurst and in 1904 was offered a commission in the Coldstream Guards, being promoted to Lieutenant in June 1907. By that time he had made such an impression on the Avening population that at the time of his coming of age in 1906 the event was "celebrated in the village with much enthusiasm". In 1910, his mother Mary died at their London home and Frederick inherited the Avening Court estate.

Between the end of 1909 and the early part of 1914 he undertook three tours of duty with the West Africa Frontier Force in Nigeria but rejoined the 1st Battalion of the Coldstream Guards in July 1914. He served with the Expeditionary Force from the outbreak of the war, through the retreat from Mons and the battles of The Marne and The Aisne. During the first battle of Ypres, he was killed at

Langemark, dying instantly from an incoming shrapnel shell. He died on the 23rd of October 1914, the day before his 29th birthday. He was unmarried.

He is buried at the St Julien Dressing Station Cemetery, where his grave is tended by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission.

He is remembered on his parent's grave in Avening Churchyard.

Evening Playgroup

Also, a big thank you to all those who helped with the Nearly New Sale which raised just over £300 for the Playgroup. We have decided that we will hold this as an annual event.

Thank you also to the Church of England Education Fund who gave us a grant to cover the cost of having the floor sanded - and very smart it looks too! Fundraising has enabled us to purchase an additional two-seater bike which the children have been using to develop their muscles pedalling their friends around the playground. We were also delighted with the arrival of our new revolving seesaw, which has further advanced our play area. We also have a new farm set with animals, play people of different cultures and disabilities, a wooden workbench and tools and art and craft materials. Thank you to everyone involved with the fundraising - the children have really benefited.

Qualifications

We are now very lucky to have highly qualified and experience staff teaching the children. In addition to all being parents themselves our Playleader, Debbie, is a qualified Primary teacher who has been teaching children for 20 years and has also recently acquired Early Years Professional Status. Our two Deputies, Sarah and Angie, are both qualified to NVQ Level 3 which is the qualification necessary to be a Playleader. New children are always welcome at either the Playgroup (open term-time Monday to Friday 9.15am to 12.15pm) or the Toddler & Baby Group (open on a Thursday between 1pm and 3pm). If you would

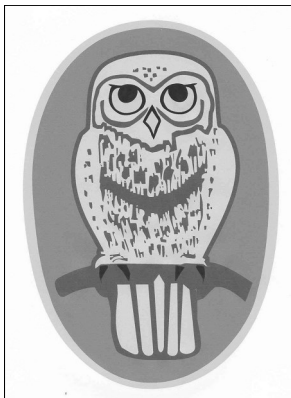

HARVESTING ARTISTS AND TOOTHBRUSHES!

Two unusual 'harvest celebration' projects were the focus for much activity for the children as they were getting ready to go off for their half-term break. The first is a project which involves Avening Primary, along with several other local schools. It is one which may see some future artists in the making! It focuses on a Rubens painting – 'An Autumn Landscape with a View of Het Steen' – which is at the National Gallery in London.

The children have studied this work of art and visited the Museum in the Park in Stroud to view several large landscape paintings of the Stroud area, on display there.

Head teacher Diana Boulton explains: "Whilst Rubens' painting is a view of his favourite home near Antwerp, the children have been encouraged to think about their own natural environment and surroundings and have enjoyed capturing them in sketches and paintings."

"This year the Harvest Festival celebrates our natural environment and the ways in which it provides for us. We have renewed our partnership with Bristol charity Feed the Children," continues Diana.

“It gave us the opportunity to run a collection with a difference for harvest festival. Instead of focusing on food, we supported the charity’s health education programme in countries where the environment is not so hospitable and clean water, for example, is not easily available. .

DATES FOR YOUR DIARIES

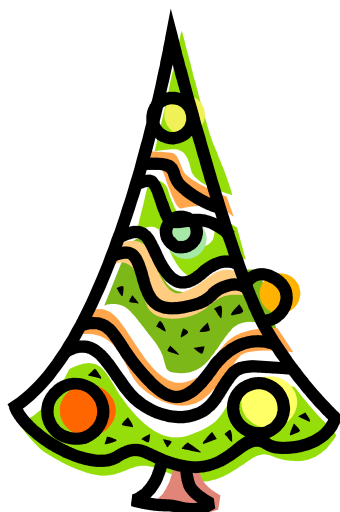

Doing Tonight?

The parish council has continued to receive comments about the antisocial behaviour of some of the young adults in the village. The council is asking everyone who is affected by the unreasonable and sometimes illegal behaviour of these young adults to report the matter to the police on 0845 0901234. The telephone line is manned 24 hours a day. This will build up a picture of what is happening in the village. If you witness a crime being committed please telephone 999 at any time.

The police are taking recent incidents seriously and have advised that if a witness calls them and can identify the offender, then the police will inform the offender's parents and issue the teenager with an antisocial behaviour warning. If two antisocial behaviour warnings are received in a 6 month period, the teenager will be on their way to receiving an antisocial behaviour order through the courts.

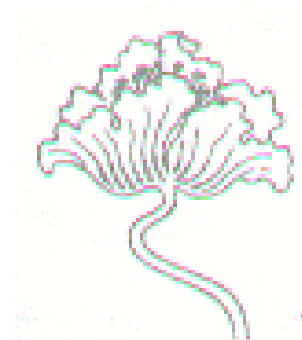

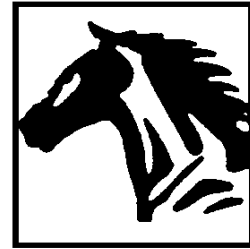

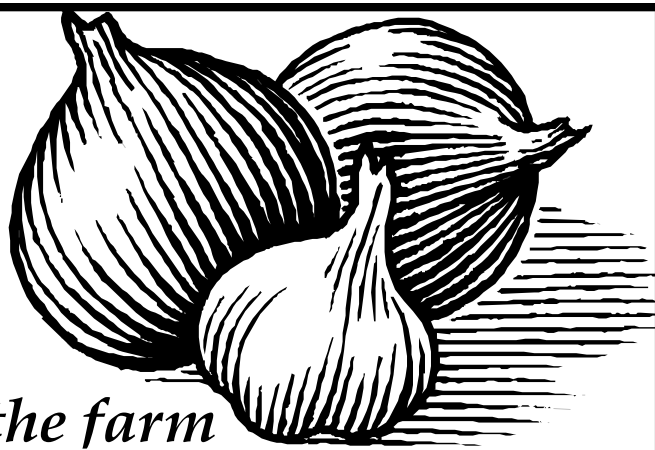
