The Parish Letter

We have not had a very encouraging start to the New Year with news of the ever deepening economic crisis, rising unemployment and an increasing number of repossessions of people's homes. Sadly, we are accustomed to hearing and seeing suffering in other parts of the world, but this present crisis is something which is affecting our own country and every community.

Often we feel helpless when the radio and television bring us news of the terrible things happening overseas but, for once, this is something we can do something about. That 'something' which the people of this country have always been good at. Remember the times you have listened to the older people in our villages and they have spoken of their childhood and of real deprivation in the war years. They experienced shortages of food, scarcity of fuel and very low wages yet, they will say: "It was not all bad.....we got through it we were all in it together". There was a strong feeling of community, of helping one another, of sharing with others the little they had, of 'listening' and 'being alongside'.

When times are good, people can be thoughtless ...too busy with their own lives to be concerned with others, less aware of others' loneliness or depression. Now is the time to find again what we have been in danger of losing... a strong sense of belonging and an awareness of our need of one another.

Now we can learn what it really means to 'love our neighbour as ourselves'.



Our days – indeed, our life Into a pattern of progress.


Into the New Year we take The joy of adventuring, to lift The routine into a challenge Of increasing achievement.

Avening Roll of Honour No.12

George Newman

Private: Royal Army Medical Corps Attached to 108th Heavy Battery Unit, RGA.

The National Archives Records show George named as Horace Jesse George Newman, indeed, he was baptised as such in Holy Cross Church on Sunday the 29th of November 1892. The Parish Register quotes his birth date as Thursday the 29th of September, some eight weeks earlier. However, he always referred to himself as George and the Army recognised him as such.

He was the eldest son of eight children (he had five brothers and two sisters), born to George William Newman (1865 -1905) and Cecilia Ann nee Fletcher (1872 - 1924). George's Newman grandfather was born in Cherington in 1832, his father being Richard Newman, born Southrop around 1793. George's mother Cecilia was of solid Avening stock. Her father John Fletcher (1835 - 1909) married Ann Ind on the 27th of August 1857 at Holy Cross Church. Both maternal ancestors can be traced back a further four generations in Avening. All of George's male ancestors appear to have been agricultural labourers. In the 1901 census George, aged 8, is listed with his family living on Old Hill.

Unfortunately, there are no records available on George's military service except that we must assume that he was in the Royal Army Medical Corps prior to the outbreak of war as the Medal Rolls tell us that he embarked for France on the 18th of August 1914, only 14 days after war was declared.

As a member of the RAMC he could have been serving in a hospital at home or overseas, as a stretcher-bearer anywhere on the front or, as is likely in his case, on attachment to a fighting unit to supply immediate medical assistance when needed.

We know that in February 1916 he was attached to the 108th Heavy Battery Unit of the Royal Garrison Artillery, serving in the Ypres area. The role of the 108th was shelling enemy positions, particularly their artillery sites and heavy gun battles developed frequently. Although set back from our own front line, this did not make them immune from attack.

We do not know exactly what happened on the fateful day of Sunday the 20th of February 1916 but George was killed along with three

others on the 108th Battery. All four men were buried side by side in Railway Chateau Cemetery a few kilometres from Ypres town centre. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission tend the cemetery and their web site has a photograph on which can be clearly seen the four graves.

George received, posthumously, the Victory Medal, the British Medal and the 1914 Star. He was 23 years old when he died and was unmarried.

I thank his niece, Peggy Chappell of Woodstock for her assistance and for the photograph of George in his army uniform.

Bon Voyage, Mrs Boulton!

Avening Primary School children are making an extraordinary New Year gesture of generosity. They are 'loaning out' their headteacher for three months to the benefit of children in the most heavily populated country in Africa, Nigeria.

Diana Boulton has travelled to Abuja in Nigeria to spend three months supporting education in rural west and north states. She is looking at the role of head teachers out there, and sharing skills and learning from her UK experiences. The trip is part of the government-backed International Extended Placements Scheme, which is led by three partners - VSO (Voluntary Services Overseas); the National College of School Leadership; and the National Association of Head Teachers.

But as she headed off on the 3042-mile trip to Nigeria, Diana explained: "This is a fantastic challenge for me. I am apprehensive at the same time as excited about the work I will be doing over the coming weeks and I very much see this as my school sharing me with the Nigerian schools.

"We are very lucky here in this country where education is given such a high profile. But I believe every child, no matter where they live, should have the opportunity for education. Even with the cultural and religious differences of Nigeria as a developing country, I very much hope I can use my experience to make a difference while I am out there.

"I leave Avening Primary School in the very capable hands of a very strong staff and governor team and I look forward to bringing a wealth of learning back myself to help our children understand the wider world."

Cherington Parish Council

We welcome Emma Dunsford as our new co-opted Councillor for Cherington and Councillor Kate Gegg has agreed to be Chair. We hope to organise another litter pick in early spring, please watch for details.

Report of a meeting between Cherington residents and Police Crime Prevention team at Cherington Village Hall on 7th January 2009.

A Public meeting was called by the Chair of Cherington Parish Council, Cllr Kate Gegg with the Police regarding a spate of burglaries in Cherington. Police present were Mark Godsland Crime Prevention Design Adviser, Community Police Officer Paul Hancock and PC Matt Sholter.

Mark Godsland explained that the Cotswolds were a low crime area but that was not a comfort to those who had experienced a burglary. There were 10 incidents of reported crime in the Cherington Parish in the last year, this was down on the two previous years.

All the Officers reiterated that all information received whether directly or messages left were logged and recorded so although they may not contact you directly, information was not ignored. Liaison between neighbours and being vigilant all helped to keep the neighbourhood safe. Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator Wendy Eldridge explained, information received that was pertinent to Cherington was circulated and any information received from residents was passed back to Neighbourhood Watch or Police.

The Police Officers answered questions from the floor including manning of Tetbury Police Station. Although manned, there are no set hours as the Officers can be called away at any time. The central phone number for non-emergency calls is **0845 090 1234**, the best number to use as your call will be logged 24 hours a day. Messages will be passed on and a report number given to you in case you need to follow up on your call.

Mark Godsland suggested he organised a follow up meeting within the next 2 to 3 months with the Safe Community Team. This will give time for the village to form ideas for an Action Plan and maybe Neighbourhood Watch could be given a higher profile.

The Parish Council will be discussing this issue at the next Parish Council Meeting at the end of January. Mark Godsland can be contacted directly for a home visit to advise on safety measures or a check list can be obtained by e-mailing mark.godsland@gloucestershire.police.uk or the Cherington Parish Council e-mail if you have access or directly from the Clerk.

POLICE REPORT FOR AVENING PARISH COUNCIL

INTRODUCTION

There were seven substantiated crimes in December 2008, this compares to six in the same period of 2007.

CRIME CATEGORY BREAKDOWN

There were two incidents of **BURGLARY**. Compared to six in 2007 Four incidents of **THEFT/HANDLING**. None in 2007 One incident of **CRIMINAL DAMAGE**. None for the same period last year

SUMMARY

Overall the figures for December 2008 have been relatively consistent, when compared to last year. Obviously as most residents will be aware Avening did suffer 6 of these Crimes on the same evening when a number of vehicles and garages were broken into resulting in items being stolen and the episode ending with a vehicle being stolen. This was later found burnt out a few miles away.

We would like to urge all residents to remove all valuables from their vehicles when left and make sure that they are locked. Homeowners can also take protective steps, making sure their homes, garages and outbuildings such as sheds are locked and secure.

The reduction in Burglary from 6 (2007) to 2 (2008) is a positive sign and we would like to continue the downward trend in Avening and ask all residents and partnership agencies to continue working alongside us to help keep Avening a safe and pleasant area to both live and work.
