The Parish Letter

After we retired from full-time parish ministry, we were invited to help with services at Avening and Cherington, when relief was needed. The pressure does not seem to have eased, but rather to have increased, because of so many retirements and departures locally in both Gloucester and Bristol Dioceses.

When we first came at the Rev Celia's request, a bit like Morecambe and Wise (although which was wise, and which Morecambe was never specified) we were struck by two things. First the beauty of the two church buildings, and then, overwhelmingly, the friendliness and warmth of our reception. It seemed like an ideal spot to repay something of all we have received during our Christian ministry - and so it has proved. We enjoy coming and have made so many friends.

We were both late ordinands, and trained together at Salisbury and Wells Theological College before being ordained as deacons. Margaret was one of the first women priested as soon as they were able, so Richard is, in temporal terms a year senior in that respect, although if you believe that you will believe anything!

Both having lost respective wife and husband to similar illnesses before embarking on new lives, it was natural we should become friends during our course, also sharing the same tutor. One thing led to another and we were married soon after we began work, and shared a first curacy in Bath and Wells diocese, where we served together thereafter. In those days it was expected that curates had to seek their bishop's permission to marry, which, at our age, led us to wonder what we might do if they refused - they didn't!

This year we celebrate 21 years of ordination as deacons, and 20 years of marriage. The eucharist has been a central part of our faith and life together and we wanted to celebrate together in every sense of the word. We are very fortunate and overjoyed that the Churchwardens and people of Holy Cross Church, Avening have agreed that we can 'con-celebrate' (it just means we will do it together) and invite some of our own family and friends to join the congregation at the Parish Eucharist on Sunday, July 21st at 11.00am.

We hope to see as many of you as possible to help celebrate and thank God on the anniversary of events which turned our lives around, and join us all for pre-lunch refreshments.



You go out to the country and find a hill, you get on a bike and ride either slowly up that hill or fast down it. You curve round trees and swerve past roots, you meet obstacles and rocks and things designed to flip you into the shrub. You have a nice time. You have a lovely time, in fact. You're so busy thinking about how to take the next bend that you don't worry about rent or promotion or roadworks. You get hot and sweaty and covered in mud. You see the landscape in a totally different way. You do a bit more riding and jumping and whizzing past trees. You get to the bottom of the hill, consume six giant flapjacks and go home with the avowed intention not just of coming back and doing it again, but bringing all your mates next time. That's it; it's that straightforward....!



But where are those bikes?? (Ed.)


Mountain Mayhem is the worlds largest 24 hour mountain biking event, with around 2,000 competitors and, by chance, Gatcombe hosted the event this year – you may have seen the signs. How could we not enter a few teams? So 3 teams of four did the event in mid-June, camped up there (fed &

watered by Hugo Winkfield - fund raising for Nepal again), each did 5-6 laps of all around 8 miles. in Gatcombe Forest, all in pretty muddy conditions and all in the set 24 hours. The winner was a solo cyclist who did 27 laps in 24 hours, thus over 215 miles in mud in 24 hours. not too bad.

So there are some serious cyclists out there but we

don't count ourselves in that category, nah, we could of course do 27 laps and all but simply don't feel like it..... Tempted? Come along! You need a half decent bike, a sense of humour and a hosepipe to wash you down after most rides. 6.30pm at the Bell, Fridays and Sundays.

Accompanied by head teacher Jane Rushton, teachers Mark Wilkinson and Katherine Turner, and teaching assistant, Kelly Wilkinson, the Owls class enjoyed three full days of water

sports and team events with most of the day spent out on the lake. The residential is a biannual event for the School and this year the children were very lucky with the weather with most of the rain coming at night when they were tucked up in their cabins or tepees.







Avening Book Club

The Sense of an Ending – Julian Barnes

Julian Barnes writes beautifully, inviting the reader to a particular depth of ponderance that is inimitable. This book is a great choice for bookclub (thanks Claire) because there is so much to talk about and contrary to its title, it is very far from giving us a sense of an ending. Although the untied-ends frustrated some of the group, it didn't lessen our regard for the novel.



The story is told through the protagonist Tony, who manages to intrigue us despite living a life that is common-garden mundane. He has survived a gentle divorce and remained good friends with his ex-wife. This is quite revealing as we may otherwise interpret Tony as a self-delusional, insensitive, dogmatic character.

The first half of the novel concerns itself with youth and it does so with great poignancy. As Tony and his friends are on the cusp of finishing school, the wait for their lives to start is interminable. The trio are then joined by Adrian Finn who is brilliantly intelligent, mature beyond his years and quietly composed. He makes the other boys seem facile and boyish in their own eyes. Their self-congratulatory retorts turn to dust in Adrian's presence and there is a barely concealed vying for his attention. Adrian leaves a strong impression on all the boys and their teachers, "Finn, I retire in five years. And I shall be happy to give you a reference if you care to take over." Another event that marks this time is the suicide of another student after discovers his girlfriend is pregnant. The boys find the suicide banal after discussing it at length, "self-indulgent and inartistic: in other words wrong". Adrian is the only one who is able to offer a philosophical perspective on it, quoting Camus.

The boys disperse as they take up their university places and Tony meets the unforgettable Veronica Ford. Her character elicits a mixed response but we all felt some sympathy for her. She's a very cutting and contemptuous character who challenges Tony's version of himself. His witty ripostes go down like a lead balloon and his glib statements are never left unchallenged. She leaves him defensive and insecure. While perusing his record collection she comments on his taste in music and when he defends it by telling her it's okay to dance to she replies, "Do you dance to it? Here? By yourself?" Despite her youth, there is no lightness about her whatsoever. He spends a weekend with her mildly disturbing family, "I was so ill at ease that I

spent the entire weekend constipated: this is my principal factual memory." And herein lies one of the biggest themes of the novel - memory.

The second half of the novel sees Tony in his retirement confronted with his unreliable and shifting recollections as the largely forgotten Veronica and Adrian reassert themselves in his life. A letter from a solicitor informs Tony that Veronica's mother bequeathed Tony some money in her will and another item. In a very quiet way the book becomes gripping reading and the reader is as desperate for answers as Tony. I won't give any more of this novel away but it is an interesting, frustrating and very thought provoking novel.
