

Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



We're now well into the new year, but I'd like to start by reflecting on events over Christmas. Many of us were involved in organising shows, fund raising sales, and events; and who could have missed Father Christmas on the music bus! On behalf of the village, a big THANK YOU to everyone who gave up their time at such a busy period. The tree proved to be very popular, and it was great that people added their own decorations. We didn't make a fuss when we put it up as we weren't sure about the logistics, but this year we will make it a proper event with carol singing (Avening Angels we need you!), and a big switch on event.

It was soon back to business though, and I am pleased to confirm that we have a new management committee for the village hall. This will take a great deal of pressure away from the PC meetings, and enable us to move on to the next priorities. It's also good to see that other organisations are moving ahead after some difficult times, thanks to the dedication of the people involved.

You will no doubt be aware of the problems on some of our roads – the flooding at either end of the village, and the particularly bad state of the Nags Head lane. There are also a number of drains blocked, which doesn't help the situation. We are constantly pressuring Highways to rectify these issues, and have the support of our County Councillor to get them resolved as soon as possible.

What do you think of our refuse services? I've never liked the blue bags for cardboard as they are almost impossible to fill single handed; and think the 'slop buckets' are far too small for a family. I'd love to get your views so that I can talk to CDC about possible improvements. I can't promise anything, but do let me know via the clerk, or direct at tony.slater@avening-pc.gov.uk.

Letter from the Parish Priest



This month we say goodbye to Canon Michael Irving, who has done such wonderful work in supporting our ministry here since Easter last year. I know you will join me in sending him many thanks for all he has done in serving the church and the community. And please do say hello to The Revd Chris Blockley when you see him – Chris will be on hand to help over the next few months.

Now ... here's a nice story.

One Sunday a mother shakes her son awake, telling him it was time to go to church. No response. Ten minutes later she is back: "Get up now, and go to church." "But mum, I don't want to. Why should I go to church — why should I bother?" Her reply: "Two reasons. Firstly, you know you should go to church on Sunday - and secondly, you're the Bishop!"

I found this story in a book by a Dominican Friar, Timothy Radcliffe called "Why go to church?" And it's a good question, isn't it? Many of us connect with God in lots of ways that don't involve church - from standing awed by a beautiful sunset to being overwhelmed by the wonder of life as we hold a new-born child. It puts us in touch with something spiritual - something beyond ourselves that might inspires us, or give us a sense of deep peace. Yet Timothy Radcliffe argues that being a Christian without going to church is like trying to play football on your own.

As a church community this Lent, we will be exploring all of these questions in our house group, meeting on Monday nights — more information available in church. In addition, we have special Church services all through Lent. It all begins on Wednesday 10th February, at 7pm at the Church of the Holy Cross. This is our Ash Wednesday service, when we keep the centuries-old tradition where people are invited forward, for their foreheads to be marked in ash with the Sign of the Cross. We do this to show our sorrow at all we have done that hurts others and our relationship with God, and our asking for forgiveness.

Then, each Sunday, our services at 9.30am in Cherington and 11am in Avening will mark the journey through Lent. All this activity is about preparing ourselves for the events leading up to Holy Week, and Easter Day itself. More in the next edition of the Villager.



Avening until she was 91 and then ill health meant move to llsom House Residential care home near Tetbury.





Illness or injury? Not sure where to turn? Get health advice ASAP

The NHS in Gloucestershire is launching its Winter ASAP (Choose Well) public information campaign this week. The campaign targets adults and parents of young children with advice on what to do if they are ill or injured and are unsure where to turn.

The promotional material encourages them to check out the App, Search the website, Ask NHS 111 or pop in to their local Pharmacy. Pharmacists can also offer advice on whether or not people need to use other NHS services. The ASAP website and App allows users to 'Search by Service' or 'Search by Condition' — providing a step-by-step guide through symptoms, self-care and signposting to the appropriate NHS service/s. They can also find opening hours and service location information.

Local people are encouraged to add the website www.asapglos.nhs.uk to their favourites and download the App free from the App store (ASAP Glos NHS). People can also follow the campaign on social media, via Facebook (ASAP Gloucestershire NHS) and Twitter (@ASAPGlosNHS). Down to Earth



The gardens at Villa Gamberia

As my friends know, I have great enthusiasm for television, but in this instance I think the BBC has got it right. In on-screen entertainment there can be no better antidote for winter despondency than current rerun of Monty Don's Italian Gardens. (Catch it on iplayer.) Let him lead you, under translucent blue skies (and, on occasion, dripping

rain) through gardens of grandeur and harmony to revelations that delight and surprise — and be reminded, simultaneously, of how much garden design is reinvention. The great Renaissance gardens of the sixteenth century took their inspiration from gardens such as the Emperor Hadrian's Villa at Tivoli. In the early twentieth century, British and American ex-pats, such as Bernard Berenson, Iris Origo, Florence Blood and Cecil Pinsent came along — and were inspired to create and *re*-create at gardens such as I Tatti, La Foce and Villa Gamberaia. (Indeed, one of our garden designers, here in Avening, revealed that she was inspired by Harold Peto's Italianate garden at Iford Manor, just south of Bath).

Of course, many of the great eighteenth century landscape gardens here were inspired by what the 'gentlemen gardeners' had seen on the Grand Tour. (One of the first was Rousham, just over the border in Oxfordshire.) A particular feature, which became very much a 'must-have' garden accessory, was the grotto. In the second episode, Monty Don visits the grottos of Villa Castello, just outside

Florence, then the Boboli Gardens, behind the Pitti Palace. A crystal grotto which has been meticulously restored is the one at Painshill, a landscape garden (south London, just inside the M25) created by the Hon Charles Hamilton in around 1750 and rescued from overgrowth and dereliction in recent years by a dedicated group of Friends. My Assistant Gardener and I took the

opportunity of a Christmas special event, a night-time Festive Walk by - er - fairy lights, to enter the grotto, lit by candles and gaze in wonder — just as the visitors in the eighteenth century would have done. The garden is open all year but the grotto only occasionally. Next up is a 'Valentine's Grotto Experience' (!), the price to include: 'a glass of Painshill Sparkling Wine, a chocolate heart and a red rose'. 'Adults only'. Hmm. Could be good ...

At last the 'cold snap' - as the weathermen call it - has arrived and plants and trees have entered their dormancy. (Well, wouldn't you too feel like going to sleep and waking up in spring?) The ideal time for winter pruning. Do take some plant-specific advice and, as the RHS say on their web-site, if the heap of prunings grows too big: STOP! My constant refrain to my AG is: 'Think about what you're doing.' Shape and rejuvenate. Cut out some old growth and stimulate extra new growth by cutting back by a third or to a bud. But not in all cases. Some shrubs do not take kindly to having limbs severed – and some respond to being cut down to base. (It takes all sorts ...) If in doubt, look it up.

I was fascinated to read a recent BBC report about the pollution-busting properties of house plants. Apparently, air fresheners, body sprays and scented cleaning products emit limonene which can, and does, combine with the ozone to create carcinogenic formaldehyde. (Well, did anyone really think that so-called air fresheners with names like 'Pine Forest' and 'Sea Mist' - my inventions, to avoid libel - could be anything but chemical cocktails?) It has been discovered that house plants, in particular English ivy (hedera helix), geraniums and lavender, can absord formaldehyde. So I sit here with a redflowering geranium beside my laptop, though I shall swap it for another from the conservatory in a day or too, just to prevent its demise from lack of light and overwork. (From absorbing all

that formaldehyde. Well, seriously ... just in case.) There is plenty of information out there.

Let us now be thankful for all those flowers and green shoots that defy 'the elements' gratuitous rampagings' — in the words of Richard Mabey in my treasured Christmas present book: 'Turned out nice again: Living with the Weather'.

Diary of a Self-Build Part 13

Well, we made it... Just! The sale of our old house went through smoothly, and although we could have done with another couple of weeks to progress the build, we were in for Christmas. I moved in initially, with no heat, not much light, and no front door; and Mandy joined me a few days later. There was a lot of mess, and a lot of dust, as we were effectively in a building site, but over the following weeks more and more was connected, and we are now on the final touches of the final fix. We even have a proper front door -2 weeks late due to a 'production problem', but we are now secure.

The lighting is still somewhat subdued in places, as we didn't order sufficient; and the low level sensor lights have just been switched on. There were also some teething troubles – the heat recovery system wasn't recovering any heat, but as the house is so well insulated, the log burner is keeping us toastie, even at -7.5°C outside! The rainwater tank had stopped working, due to all of the electrical work that was going on – that's a shame as there are 3,000 litres of free water ready to flush our toilets!



Our luck hasn't got any better either – our lovely new bedroom curtains arrived in the wrong colour, so they will have to be made again. We still don't have a proper main staircase, as the supplier seems completely unable to keep to deadlines.

The last big thing left to do inside was our special reflective stretch ceiling on the main floor — this went in without a hitch, looks

great. Now we just have the installation of our stairwell light, which should look spectacular, and the small matter of the internal doors; the lack of which was a bit embarrassing at Christmas for our guests – you can take open plan living too far! We are gradually unpacking boxes as rooms are completed, and settling into a new way of low energy, and (hopefully) low cost living, although this will be more difficult as two suppliers failed to fulfil our solar panel requirement.

Outside, the final zinc cappings are finished, making us completely water tight, and the stonework is also complete. The main deck will be constructed at the end of January. We have designs for the garden, but we will take a break to recover (both mentally and financially!) before starting again in the spring. On the TV front, Charlie will be with us on 10th March for the final 'Reveal', and the programme should be aired in the new series of Building the Dream starting in April on Channel 4.

A Murmeration of Starlings

Early in January, while standing near a reed bed, near South Cerney, I witnessed a huge murmuration of starlings. Before this, I had only seen a few seconds of this phenomenon on TV. As the light faded, we decided to return to the car, as we had to cross two very wet muddy fields. After walking about two hundred yards, we looked back and the birds had also decided it was time to stop their aerobatics. They had practically all dropped down into the reed bed to roost.
