# Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



We lost a great man last month — it cannot be overstated what Jim Parsons did for Avening over many decades of loyal service as a long serving District Councillor, Parish Councillor and chairman, and member of a plethora of other committees - he always fought to get good deals for the village and the wider community. I would never have progressed to be PC chairman without his encouragement and support — Jim's colossal knowledge, musical talent, and friendship will be sorely missed, as will his endless supply of entertaining local anecdotes.

I recently had a meeting with the area Highways manager to review the most pressing problems on our local roads – the current issues list and actions log can be seen on the website, but I thought it might be useful to add some context here:

There is currently an estimated £80m backlog of repairs in Gloucestershire – this is easily evidenced by the crumbling infrastructure around us. There are no planned improvements in the area to cater for the additional 800 homes in Tetbury. The repairs budget is shared between 37 parishes, and many town councils, and all works are given relative priority throughout the county. Very little of the election promised £150m will filter down to our local roads. Footpaths are also the responsibility of Highways. The PC pays for much of the regular grass cutting to keep verges tidy and safe, as well as other local safety initiatives, but we are unable to touch the roads or signs themselves.

We work closely with Highways, which does produce improved results, but only political pressure on GCC will encourage them to give road maintenance budgets a higher priority. Stephen Hirst is our new County Councillor, and he often attends our meetings - we are seeking his help to actively lobby the cabinet on our behalf.



## **Avening Playgroup**

This term we have welcomed eight new children to playgroup. They all seem to be having a good time and are making new friends and following the playgroup routine very well. This year is looking to be a busy one with lots of fun and learning ahead of us.

You may remember that we received a grant during the summer term in 2016 to help develop the outside area to encourage the children to become fit and active. Part of the money was spent on storage containers, so that we could have a lot more resources outside and accessible to the children. Over the summer break this year, staff have re-organised the outside area and have added baskets of different toys and materials which we hang under our covered area each day. These can be used for construction, sand and water play and used in the mud kitchen.

Angie, Sarah and myself have been encouraging the children to put back items when they have finished with them both inside and out. This encourages the children to become independent and to work together as a team when it is time to clear up at the end of a session. So far they have been doing very well.

At playgroup we have a set routine, as a routine helps young children feel settled and confident. Each day we have circle time, register and count the children, do daily exercising to music, snack time, Letters and Sounds and story time which are all led by one of our staff. For the rest of each session the children are encouraged to play inside or outside with whatever they wish to. The playgroup staff join in and extend the children's learning as they play. Research has found that children learn best when they are really focused on an activity, and they are more likely to be focused when they are choosing to do something themselves.

## **Down to Earth**



Early autumn late afternoon in Westonbirt

As I write, nature is on that gradual approach to the climactic firework display known as 'autumn colours' and this approach can be the loveliest time. The light shafts from a lower angle, picking up the texture and subtle foliage coloration more distinctly. That old cliché of nature being 'on the turn' holds true. Before the arrival of cooler, drier and less sunny days of winter, the deciduous trees prepare to take a break from photosynthesis, a

process whereby sunlight, water and carbon dioxide are converted into sugars that produce energy, with the aid of chlorophyll. This latter is the green pigment. As the chlorophyll is used up with no replacement, the green fades and allows the existing carotenoid pigments of yellow and orange to show through. Anthocyanin pigments on the other hand, the reds and purples, are only manufactured in the autumn from the remaining sugars.

With Westonbirt Arboretum on our doorstep, we are spoilt. Early morning or late afternoon are the best times. Personally, I prefer the more mature acers in and off the Mitchell Drive to the dumpy specimens in the Japanese Maple Collection. The acers are regarded as the show-stoppers, but look out for others, too: the buttermilk yellow of the ginkgo biloba and the Japanese larch, the metallic hues of the parrotia persica, or Persian ironwood, and the purply red of the liquidambar.

And then there is the case of the poor old horse chestnut, aesculus hippocastanum. To see it in mid-summer, you would think autumn had arrived early. Wrong. The arrival of autumn leaf colour depends entirely on the length of daylight. No, the horse chestnut has, for several years now, suffered from the onslaught of the leaf miner moth which lays its eggs within the leaves. This weakens the tree, brings on premature leaf drop but does not kill it. The leaf miner was first identified in this country in 2002 in Wimbledon, since which time it has 'wombled' its way across most of the country, not clearing up the litter but turning these majestic trees a rusty shade of brown. More information is on the RHS web-site.

Autumn is not associated with plant fragrance, but while in Westonbirt, do find

your way to the katsura tree or cercidiphyllum japonicum, which smells strongly of burnt sugar. Indeed, its autumn colouring has more than a hint of caramel. According to the Cambridge Botanic Garden web-site: 'The sweet scent [of the katsura] is caused by the molecule maltol that is released as the leaf breaks down, which is indeed the same molecule released

when sugar is burnt to become caramel'. Closer to home, in my garden, an actaea simplex 'Brunette', otherwise known as baneberry, has finally settled down and produced flowers; a plant of deep maroon / purple foliage, happiest in a sheltered, shady spot in ground enriched with organic matter, it produces fragrant white flowers in early autumn. (Be aware, though, that the berries are poisonous).

Today we would not expect an eminent garden designer to concern himself with cemeteries, yet in the first half of the nineteenth century, John Claudius Loudon, prolific garden writer, designer and theorist, saw it almost as a public obligation. After travelling to Poland, St Petersburg and Moscow in the midst of the Napoleonic Wars and seeing bodies lying unburied, while back in England graveyards were not merely full but morbidly overcrowded, he formulated

principles of lay-out and horticultural or arboricultural embellishment for the new private companies that embarked the building on cemeteries. The Abbey Cemetery in Bath was designed by him in 1843, the same year as he published: 'On the Laying Out, **Planting** and Managing of Cemeteries and on the of Churchyards'. **Improvement** According to the Parks and Gardens UK web-site his principles were: 'to

dispose of the dead in a hygienic manner, to improve the morals and taste of society, by its architectural quality and botanical riches, and to serve as a historical record for future generations'. Why not stop a while to take in the poignant beauty of this now slightly overgrown place, overlooking the city on the southern side; the entrance gate is at the bottom of Ralph Allen Drive.

## **Avening Youth Club**

With the new team from the Door arriving bright and early, and supported from Cassie, a great session was enjoyed by a decent group of youngsters.

Our regular team leader will be Laura and on the first session, her line manager, John Williams also joined the fun. Avening Church of England Education Fund is the major backer for this year, and has agreed a contract with The Door to provide 39 sessions during the academic year.

If the first session is anything to go by, then it will be lively and good fun!

The Youth Club is also delighted to be able to enjoy the better facilities that the Memorial Hall now offers and some of the previously inaccessible areas are now free to use. This allows us better access to the Youth Club store, making it easier to use the equipment that has been acquired over the years, including the larger sports equipment like the pool table. The Youth Club is very grateful for the continued support from Avening Parish Council, who are paying for the Hall hire over the academic year. Thank you!



## **Down Memory Lane**

## Revd. Marriott Rector of Cherington in the garden of Cherington Rectory

The Reverend Charles Marriott was Rector of Cherington between 1896 and 1912, when he died. His photograph was taken outside Cherington Rectory. The nearest window seen here was the kitchen window. The window in the single story extension was in the back kitchen, with a coal room and a passage to the back door and pantry. The greenhouse was gone by the 1960s.

The Reverend Marriott was born in Manchester in 1838 and was educated at Queen's College, Oxford. He married Blanche Katherine Curzon on 6 December 1892 in Kensington. She was born in 1844 at Parham, Sussex and married after the death of her mother in early 1892.

(so she married at the age of 48 after the death of her mother? Is there a romantic story there - or did she just need a home?

## Dying without a Will. Now that's a real tragedy.



## **Avening Parish Council**



The minutes of the meetings will be published shortly but some of the issues raised at the meeting are listed below:

#### **Councillor Jim Parsons**

Councillors expressed their sadness about the recent death of Jim Parsons, he was such as asset to the Parish Council and a lovely man who will be greatly missed.

In memory of Jim, Councillors agreed to re-name the Reading Room, in the Memorial Hall, The Jim Parsons Reading Room.

#### **Map Boards**

The map boards for visitors to the village are now in place and have been well received. We are also planning to put up boards in the Memorial Hall listing past and present recipients of Villager of the Year awards.

#### **School Kitchen**

The refurbishment has now been completed and we have received lovely feedback from those using it.

#### **New Screen for Memorial Hall**

The new screen has been installed and has proved to be a great improvement. The cinema club have noted that there is less of a need for subtitles due to the improved sound system.

#### **Old Hill**

Two residents of Old Hill attended the meeting to express their concern about a number of delivery vehicles that have caused damage to property on Old Hill following inappropriate access via Powis Lane. The Council has agreed to further investigate the possibility of putting up additional signage to indicate the width restriction of the lane, to try to deter larger vehicles.

#### **Playing Field – Next Stage**

Further meetings are scheduled to agree plans for the proposed new football pitch and additional improvements to the site. Funding sources are also being investigated.

#### **Defibrillator**

We will be applying for a £500 grant towards a second defibrillator for the village once the fate of the phone box in the Sunground has been finalised.

#### **Dog Waste Bin**

We are going to install an additional dog waste bin to be sited on Star Lane, and one in Mays Lane, to encourage walkers to pick up after their dogs.

#### **Highways**

Following a visit by the area Highways manager, there has been progress on a number of road issues: A white 'H' line is due to be painted to allow better visibility at the Point Road junction; a broken pipe is scheduled to be repaired on Ash Path, along with some patching of the damaged surface, and drains around the village are to be cleaned.
