

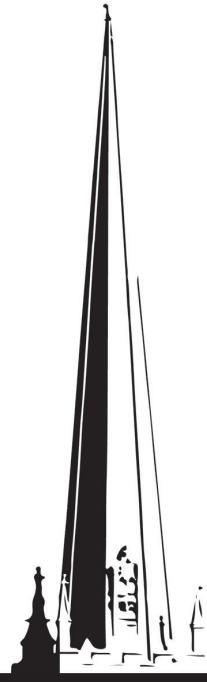

Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



Did you know that our much loved village hall is a registered war memorial? We know it as the Memorial Hall, and it was built in 1922 in memory of the fallen of World War One. I am highlighting this in a very special year, because the old lady of the village needs some significant tender loving care to ensure she continues to be the centre of village life for years to come. Regular readers and hall users will be aware of the internal improvements made over the last couple of years – a new kitchen; refurbished reading room; new fire alarm system; PA and projection system, plus all the usual annual maintenance. We now need to turn our attention to the structure and fabric of the building, and the roof is top of the list. Early estimates indicate about £45,000, and along with other identified work, we are looking at some £50,000 of maintenance needed!

We can't do this alone, and we are following a number of lines to raise funds: The main source will be from grants – local council funds are available for these schemes, but being a war memorial, this opens other avenues as well. We are also reaching out to the community, and are pleased to launch a scheme for families to 'buy a tile' in memory of a relative who fell during any military conflict. Details are shown later in the magazine, but the idea is that for a donation, your details and story will be entered into a commemorative book for all to read. You will, of course, be helping to preserve the hall. In researching the ownership of the hall (confirmed as the PC), we came across a copy of the original conveyance document – it's amazing how many familiar names are on the deed – Playne, Calcutt and Lowsley-Williams to name a few. I've put a copy of this document on the website, and the new History Pages will soon feature the stories of our heroes from WW1.

We are closing in on a supplier to provision the new fence around the play equipment at the field, and the PC have confirmed the south west gate to the field will no longer be available in order to complete the safe zone. It will also be a dog free area.

The first big event after the holidays is the Queen Matilda Feast or Pig Face Day on September 15th from 5pm in the church, and then in the hall for the feast - a pig roast at £4 a head. Bring your own mead, which can be left in the hall beforehand. Mandy and I are honoured to be chosen as Queen Matilda and King William, and we look forward to welcoming many of our citizens for the celebration. The PC is supporting the event, and are subsidising costume hire from Cotswold Costumes, but the offer is limited, so book as soon as you can.

There are some special things going on in September

.... Start of a new term

If you are leaving your youngster for the first day of term it is a very significant moment – as you walk away from the school on 4th September come and have a drink and a snack up in the church ‘café on the hill’. The invitation is also open to all parents – and indeed anyone else, 8.45 to 10am. We are calling it ‘Tea and Tissues’ but you are more than welcome even if you are not feeling the need for the tissues.

.... Queen Matilda and Pig Face Day

The Avening village history goes back many centuries and includes the period at the end of the 11th century when our church was built in unique circumstances. On 15th September we will celebrate some of the events of that time, firstly in church at 5pm and then moving to the hall for a medieval feast organised by the Parish Council. Do join their Majesties.

.... Harvest

Also on 15th Cherington will celebrate harvest festival with a service in church at 5.30pm followed by supper in the hall.

.... Outdoors

Many people find that their most profoundly spiritual moments are when they are in the great outdoors. Forest Church is a modern movement, with roots in the long Christian tradition of engagement in nature, such as the Celtic and Franciscan approaches. It offers the opportunity to relate to God and the depth of existence in and through our connection with the natural world, without the normal constraints and formalities of a service in a church building.

We are planning such an event on the afternoon of Saturday 22nd September. By kind permission of Avening residents Estelle and Ant St John Smith, it will be held in their wood which is about a mile’s walk from Avening village but may also be accessed by car. Activities will be ‘child-friendly’ and there will be some time for refreshments so bring a drink and a snack, although marshmallows for cooking on the fire will be provided. There are plenty of logs to sit on but you may like to bring a camping chair.

.... Café Church

There will be another café style service at Avening on 30th September, 11am. This very informal approach offers an opportunity to meet with each other, share some thoughts and offer some worship alongside a cup of coffee (or

tea) and a piece of cake.

Churchyard tidy-ups at Avening continue on alternate Tuesdays, 6pm to 7pm - volunteers very welcome.

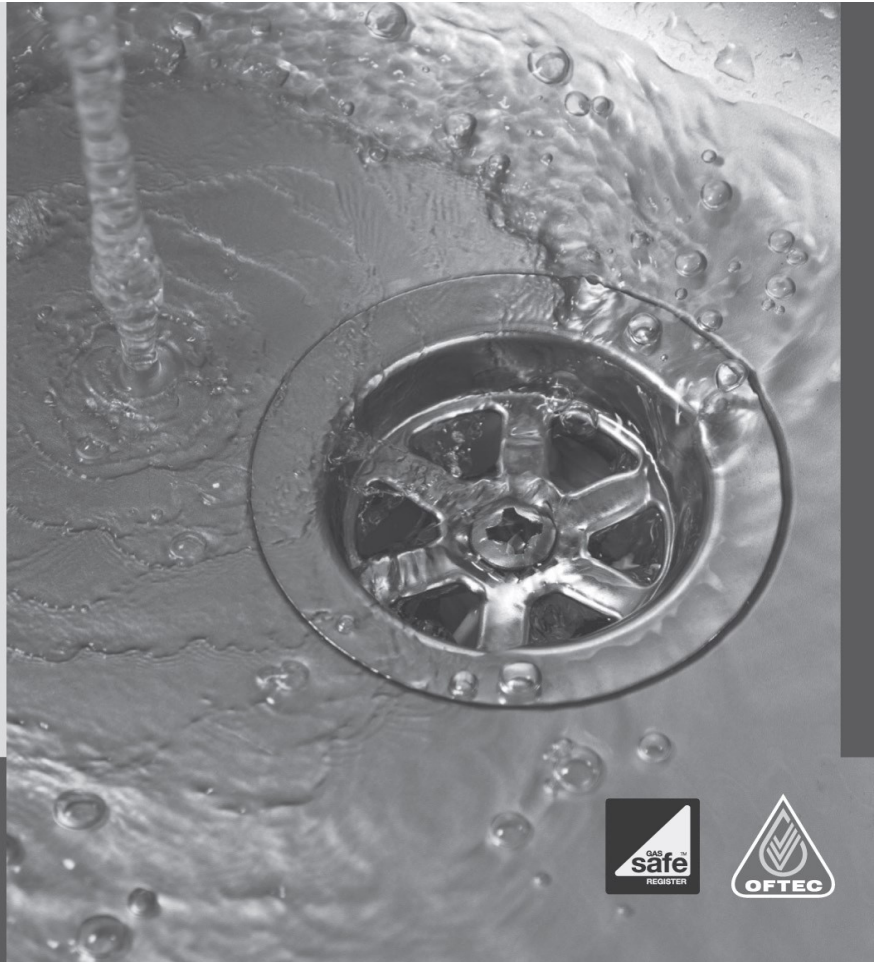

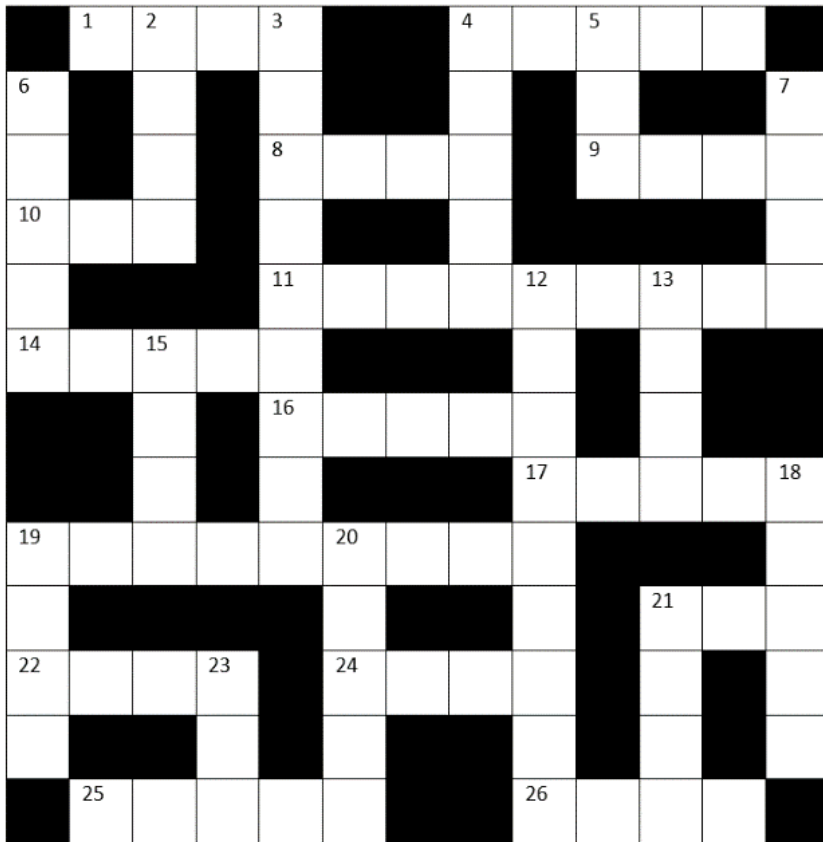

Just a brief report for this month as we do not have a full programme of activities during August. However, we continued to provide lunches and teas under our “Bite to Eat” scheme. A very lively 50th birthday party tea at Cherington Village hall was much appreciated by the guests as was the Stroud Macular Society lunch which has become a regular event in the Avening Social Club.

We held a Social Evening for our members with an excellent “bring and share” supper. We invited Ross Frowen the author of 10,000 Bowls of Soup to talk to us about the project inspired by his son who had worked with many of the refugees who had escaped mostly in dinghies from war torn Syria and Afghanistan landing on the Greek Islands where the local authorities were overwhelmed by the sheer number of arrivals. Of course many of you may know that the project to produce the book was entirely carried out by Avening residents. At the end of the evening many books were sold to the members and a cheque given to Medecin Sans Frontieres who are now overseeing the care of most of the refugees.

We do not often mention all the activities that we could and take part in that are organised by the Gloucestershire Federation of WIs. Looking through the latest newssheet they include Bowls, Batik, Croquet, Drummimg, Clay Pigeon Shooting and Archery taster days. An annual holiday is arranged and this year it is to Malta. These activities are all very well supported.

I am pleased to report that the number of our members has increased to 40 this year.

Our September speaker is Dick Robinson whose illustrated talk is entitled “The Amazing WW1 Diaries of Sister Edith Appleton OBE”. Edith was Dick’s great aunt and she never spoke of her wartime experience. She trained at Barts and later served as a QA sister in Flanders and France throughout the 1st World War. She wrote a fascinating daily diary, discovered by Dick after it had lain in a drawer for 50 years, which was published in 2012 by the Imperial War Museum. Excerpts have been broadcast on radio and television.

The talk will take place during our meeting on Thursday 13th September at 7.30 pm at the Memorial Hall. Visitors are very welcome to join us.

Amazingly we ran out of the barbecue, Pimms, ice creams and for the first time ever, raffle tickets too.

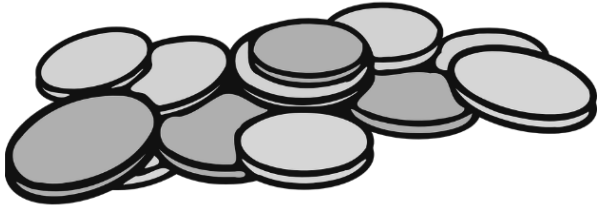
There were people everywhere! It was so lovely to see so many people enjoying themselves.

Our Parish Church — How Much Does it Cost?



How much are the average daily outgoings of Avening Parish Church? £5?, £10?, £20?

No, last year nearly £100 went from the funds each day, well over £2500 each month and this year is not likely to be less.

Where does it all go? In very round figures over a third on maintenance of the church building and the churchyard, a quarter or so on general running costs (including insurances, heating, church services) and about a third to the work of the Diocese of Gloucester. This last outgoing is used by the Diocese to pay those clergy who receive an income (many do not), to house clergy, provide pensions and training, together with the many administrative costs of running the Diocese. It is worth noting that many paid clergy are working and living in deprived areas and providing for their local community in a way that no other organisation does.

Where does all this money come from? From Church of England central funds? - No. From Diocesan funds? – No. from thin air? – No. It is all locally raised from the regular giving of those who support the church, from fund raising, from fees charged for weddings and funerals, and from other donations and bequests. Nevertheless it is looking likely that there will be a significant deficit in the church accounts by the end of this year.

The management of all this is a big undertaking for the small group of volunteers who are involved in the running of our parish church and thanks go to them for their time, energy and commitment.

If you value the presence of the church in Avening and across Gloucestershire, even if you do not choose to worship here regularly, and would like to contribute to the financial demands outlined above there are several ways to do this. It could, for example, be a one-off donation or a monthly direct debit, which greatly helps in budgeting expenditure.

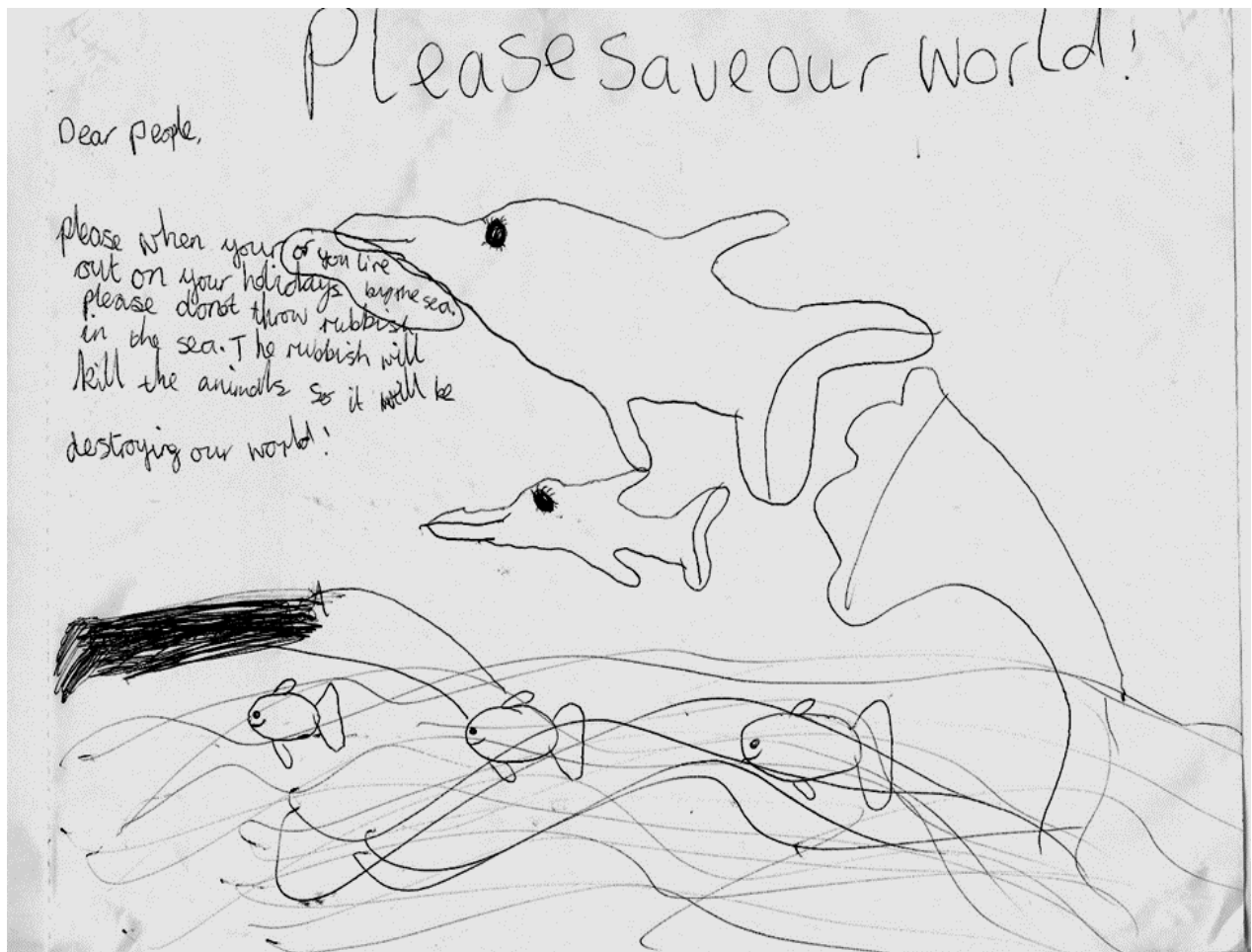
'Dear People' - I Think That Means You!

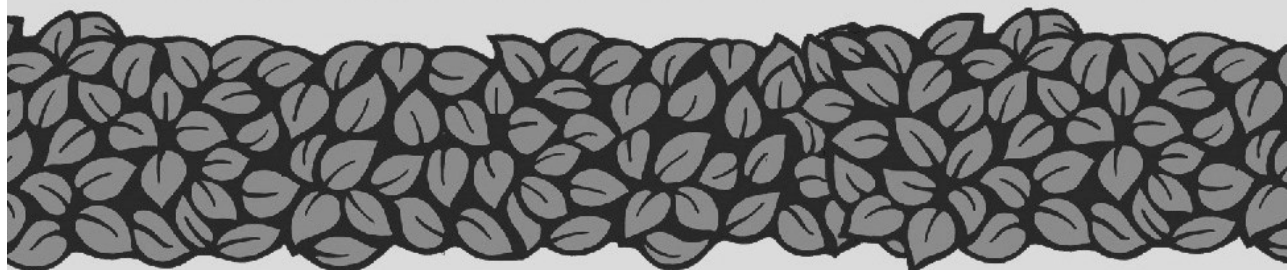

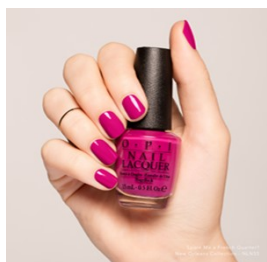
