Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader

We started the new term discussing a new proposal for the 'exception' development site opposite Playgroup. The site remains in the hands of GCC as a number of developers have not progressed with the purchase, considering the site too difficult. We thought the draft presented had quite a few shortcomings – density of development; wrong mix of properties; significant shortage of parking; and of course access issues through Lawrence Road and out onto Hampton Hill. For this we have asked them to ensure Highways make improvements to the junction before we approve anything. On the plus side, any development will be for local people – those in the parish, or direct connections to family.

In December we also had a pre-application view of the proposals at the Old Quarries. This was more acceptable as a proposal, but we have concerns over additional traffic down Rectory Lane, and the main entrance at the last corner out of Avening towards Nailsworth.

With a total of 25 new dwellings, plus some individual developments, we have general concerns over local infrastructure and specifically the impact on our school. Please look out for both applications in due course on the CDC planning portal – they will also be discussed formally at future PC meetings.

We have so far raised over £300 from the sale of the WW1 Son-et-lumiere DVDs and sponsorship of roof tiles – we'll be collating the stories in due course, but it's not too late to tell your hero stories or purchase a DVD.

This summer we will have an open gardens day – the Mark Townsend Charitable Trust will be organising the event on 23rd June, so if you can help, would like to open your garden, or perhaps provide refreshments along the route, please contact the trust. More details will follow.

I was unable to attend the Christmas tree lighting this year, but I understand it went really well, and we already have ideas for the next one! Special thanks to Mel Young and the Angels for the evening entertainment. The Avening Angels provided some wonderful performances at the church carol concert, which as always was well attended, and later entertained the customers of the Queen Matilda and the Bell. They were followed with more songs led by Amanda and Pip – what a lot of talent we have!

We're now well into 2019, but change is coming (no, not Brexit – well probably not anyway!) – We know we will need at least 2 new councillors in the May

local elections. No experience is needed, as all you need is a can-do attitude – we want to get things done; to organise events; and to engage all parts of the community. You can live in any part of the village, be of any age (we'd really like to attract some younger members, as we can be a little out of touch), or have useful skills. If you want to find out more, contact me, the clerk, or any councillor, or come along to any meeting – they're the 3rd Thursday of every month in the Jim Parsons room at the Memorial Hall.

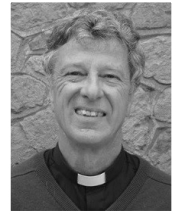

In our last article of 2018 we were planning the much-awaited Christmas Bonanza. It all seems so long ago now, but we just have to thank everyone who has supported this event in any way. We are very grateful as it is the Playgroup's main fund-raising event and it proved to be a big success. It was a pleasure working alongside FOAS to raise much needed funds for the children to enjoy at both the Playgroup and Avening School. As soon as the Christmas Bonanza was over the children were busy making Christmas decorations, cards, calendars and Christmas sponge paintings. The children also learnt about the Christmas Nativity and acted out the story with the help of some dolls. We practised some Christmas songs, which the children sang to parents on their last day before the holiday.

This term the children have been describing, finding, cutting, colouring and comparing different shapes. They have been doing lots of jigsaws and making shapes out of playdough. The children have also been enjoying our new equipment: large scales, a creeper crawler and a large fishing game with numbers. All of these help with physical, mathematical and social development.

Children usually join us from the start of the term in which they turn 3 years old, but we can accept children a term earlier when we have enough spaces. We can also accept children with two year funding, when ratios allow. Our current opening times are from 9.15am until 12.15 pm from Monday to Friday. On a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday we run a lunch club which finishes at 1.15pm.

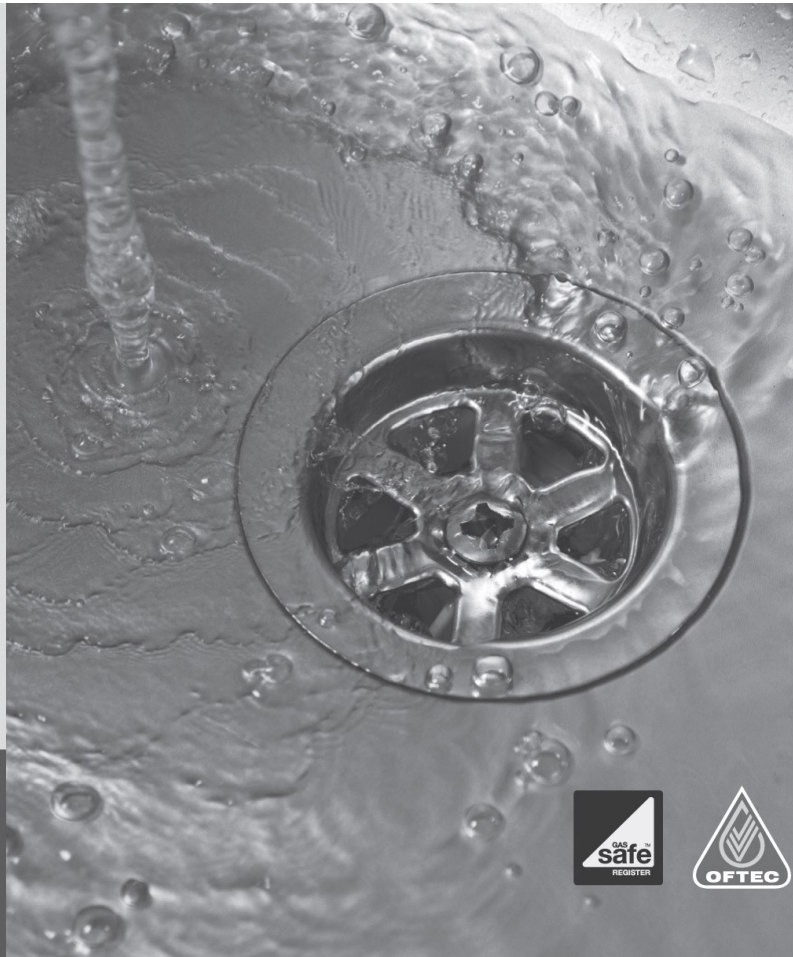

Are you looking after someone who suffers from dementia, and have concerns about what will happen if they go missing?

Symptoms of dementia can include confusion and disorientation which make it difficult for the individual to know where they are going and why, and for search teams to locate them. You can help by signing up to the **Herbert Protocol** on their behalf, filling in significant details on a simple form which is handed to police when the person is reported missing. It includes things like previous addresses and special locations, such as a family grave, which may be a draw to them; hobbies and regular routines; photos and up to date description - sometimes hard to recall in the panic of finding that your loved one has gone missing.

Gloucestershire Constabulary is working with the Alzheimer's Society to promote this scheme, named after war veteran George Herbert who died whilst missing and trying to return to his childhood home.

When three scientifically-minded Cirencester friends thought of forming a small group to enjoy talks on a range of scientific subjects, little could they have foreseen that twenty-one years later it would be flourishing with over 200 members. Its name belies the wide area from which members come, stretching from Stroud in the West, northwards to Cheltenham and Malmesbury in the South.

Each year the society holds a series of ten lectures on a varied selection of topics intended to appeal to a wide variety of interests and levels of scientific background. Members include not only scientists, doctors and engineers but also many who have a general interest in science and technology. Our friendly meetings are held at 7.30pm on the second Wednesday of each month, usually at the Royal Agricultural University. Avening Parish Council Meeting 17th January 2019

The minutes of the meeting will be published shortly, but some of the items discussed are summarised below:

Crime

One crime was reported in December for an online offence. Councillors have asked the police to provide more details with their reports like they used to do.

Proposed Planning

Chris Knibbs of Bromford Housing Association on behalf of Gloucestershire Rural Housing Association and Martin Hutchings of GRCC were in attendance as they are working with GCC to utilise the 'exception' site at the end of the Sunground for affordable/rental properties. As the site failed to sell to a developer, and in response to the 2014 housing needs survey, they are making an initial proposal for affordable housing. Although no firm plans have yet been submitted, the Parish Council were given a draft proposal for consideration. The PC were generally supportive of the need for affordable housing, but this proposal was not well received for a number of significant reasons: the density of development; mix of property types; lack of parking; access issues along Lawrence Road, and the exit onto Hampton Hill. When added to the application proposed for housing at the Old Quarries site, there was additional concern regarding the increase in the volume of traffic and the impact it will have on local amenities, especially the school.

Memorial Hall

Minor improvements and additional safety work at the Memorial Hall continues. Grant applications will be made for the roof replacement project – this was delayed due to sickness.

Playground

Improvements to disabled access by dropping the curbs to the playing field at Sunground, and removing the steep step into the field have been agreed by GCC, and funding is being sought to carry out the work as soon as possible. The PC is initially attempting to source second hand fencing from Highways/Amey and local councils before appointing a contractor to complete the fencing of the play equipment.

Defibrillator

The battery on the defibrillator has been changed. The PC are investigating the suitability of the old phone box at the junction of Old Hill/Lawrence Road for a second unit.

Recycling

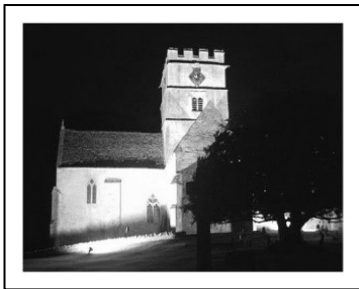

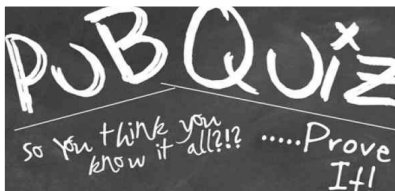
