Villager of the Year



Footpaths

Last month I highlighted some issues with local footpaths, and asked landowners to help keep them open. A landowner asked me to point out that this is a 2-way relationship. The public should always keep to the footpath, and keep dogs under control – basic country code stuff. We are lucky enough to have lots of fields around us, but where animals might be present dogs should ALWAYS be on a lead. I include the playing field here, as there have been incidents recently where children have been knocked over by boisterous pets and could have been hurt. Know your pet and keep it under control! Farms and woodlands are private property and are working environments so can be dangerous – sometimes it is necessary to be less flexible with access, so please adhere to any notices or instructions,

and be extra careful. Most landowners are only too happy to allow people to walk across their land but it has to be respected. The majority of walkers genuinely respect the countryside, but I don't think many would be happy if random people rocked up in their gardens and let their dogs poo everywhere, and pushed their boundary fences down!

Living an uncertain life in an uncertain world

As this is being written it is not known whether you are now reading it in a country that still belongs to the EU: either way there remain many uncertainties about the future of politics and economics in our country.

Such lack of certainty often pervades our personal lives too. Spare a thought for those people some two thousand years ago who saw the person they most respected, the one who seemed to be bringing hope and love to a challenging world, being utterly humiliated, tortured and murdered in the most degrading way. To them at that time any chance of a bright future would appear to have gone: the world and their lives devastated.

We are now entering a period of the year when the events surrounding the life of Jesus, his death and resurrection come into sharp focus. What really did happen then? Read the gospel accounts and perhaps one or more of the many books that have



been written about it, then form your own judgement. However, whatever it was that did happen, the result on those friends of Jesus was quite extraordinary: they changed from being dejected and demoralised to being a joyful and successful force for good. The Christian community they initiated has transformed the lives of countless others over the years since, including the lives of many of our Avening and Cherington villagers today.

So if you are feeling that there seems little hope, or even just that all is not well, the Easter story may provide some perspective and encouragement to see things differently. That may not necessarily be easy to do on one's own. Our church services (see below) and our church communities are here for all. Church is not for the holy and righteous, it is for each of us wherever we 'are at' and shares the Easter message with everyone. If you are not used to churchy things, why not give it a try? Our churches will be holding services for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, the much valued Tenebrae service on Good Friday with the Avening Angels and Easter Sunday not to mention the rest of the year.

Annual Church Meetings

These are the occasions when our churches review the past year and look forward to the coming one. This can include the appointment of wardens and church council members.

All Age Services

As we came to the end of Fairtrade Fortnight our service a Cherington on Sunday $\mathbf{10}^{\text{th}}$ March reminded us that there are many people in our world who are

treated unfairly: buying Fairtrade goods – bananas, coffee, tea, chocolate, wine, gold and many others – can help to ensure that the world becomes a fairer place.

The Palm Sunday service at Cherington (9.30 am) will also be a very family friendly one, not too long and with something for everyone.



Message from Gloucestershire Constabulary

Stalking is one of the most frequently experienced forms of abuse and it can terrify and destroy the lives of victims. Around 1 in 5 women and 1 in 12 men have experienced stalking in their lifetime in the UK. (Suzy Lamplugh Trust 2016)

We're already running radio adverts and have engagement vehicle events planned across the county in April to coincide with National Stalking Awareness Week (W/C 8th April). We'll also be promoting the campaign through social media in early April.





Riley Reminisces

The Western Desert

Our detachment of six remained as a team, and as well as my normal duties, I had been elected cook, with rations which were picked up from Daily Indenture Depots. Bread was out of the question and our flour had to be sieved. A type of biscuit prevailed and one tried all sorts to make it palatable. Everything generally came out of tins, but fish was very often on the menu. A well-aimed grenade thrown into the Med would supply all sorts of fish - some known, some unknown! Whatever, we ate it and we lived. When things were quiet, we would have a 'springbok' hunt, chasing a type of deer with our Jeep. It was the only fresh meat we ever had but luckily our crane-driver had butchery experience.



How did we cook? Petrol drained from crashed aircraft into a four-gallon tank is the short answer. A forty-gallon drum with the top cut off was our oven. To say we lived like gypsies would be to insult the gypsy. Water was scarce and as we had to transport all our necessities, washing was not a priority. A dip in the Med when possible just left a

deposit of salt on the skin. We usually filled our water bottles in the morning and apart from making tea and a hot drink with our supplies, that was our daily ration. Despite the cooking all of our team survived in the best of health!

When I first was posted to the Western Desert Air Force we were very poorly equipped. Still, a few Gloster Gladiators remained, then to be equipped with Hurricanes which had seen better days but soon the Lease-Lend operation came into force with fighters (Tomahawks, Kittyhawks and War Hawks) and eventually a few Spitfires. With medium bombers Maryland, Baltimore and Bostons, we were able to make inroads. But true to bad planning, we did not have the proper tools to service them. We borrowed what we could from the Yanks nearby and managed until our own supplies were satisfactory.

Eventually the War Zone in the Middle East ceased with Rommel being driven out. Preparation for the invasion of Sicily was underway. Our detachments were disbanded and we were transhipped back to the Canal Zone to various units. Luckily our "gang" stayed together to work out our remaining tour of duty at 108 M.U. Our Unit was employed building MK1 Anson aircraft and converting them

to flying radar schools. Conditions were now much better, we could now bathe in the Bitter Lakes and entertainment was laid on.

Unfortunately, things became a little ugly as we were now overdue for repatriation to the U.K. An arsonist emerged from the Unit and set fire to our outside cinema. A short while after, the Reading Room came in for the same treatment and the Special Investigations Bureau were called. Because of our overdue return to the U.K. we were suspect, but the arsonist was still at large. After more fires, more interviews, we were still suspect but luckily, he was caught stuffing the piano in the NAAFI. We were saved and away at last.

Away by ship from Alexandria to Marseilles, thence a long and arduous rail trip across war-torn France to Dieppe (we were given a cushion to ease the ache on one's bottom!) there to wait our turn on a ferry for Newhaven in the UK. At a clearance point we were relieved of our khaki uniforms and issued with new RAF blue uniforms. We were then issued with railway warrants and ration cards for three weeks embarkation leave.

The month is now November 1945 and the end of a very adventurous and dangerous time of my life. Would I have changed it? The answer is a definite "No"!






