## Around Gloucestershire

Anyone who has had to cancel or postpone a wedding<sup>1</sup> or christening may be finding the lockdown particularly stressful. Gloucestershire County Council has put together a page detailing changes to how births and deaths are registered and what to do if you are required to produce documents to access other services (eg for child benefit or universal credit): <https://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/births-marriages-deaths-and-civil-partnerships/>

On 11 May, the Government said that it was examining how to enable people to gather in slightly larger groups to better facilitate small weddings. As of Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> of May, no guidance has been issued and the government website states that you cannot get married or celebrate a civil partnership 'at the moment', see <https://www.gov.uk/marriages-civil-partnerships> for updated information.

Our hearts go out to anyone who is grieving for the loss of a loved one. It's a difficult subject to tackle, but we hope that by including these links some of the practical headaches may be lessened. If someone you care about is approaching the end of their life, then the brilliant people at Marie Curie have put together a special section on their website <https://www.mariecurie.org.uk/help/support/coronavirus> to help support you during these saddest of days.

'The staff are working very hard and keeping the spirits up of the residents, trying to keep life creative for them,' they told us. 'Whilst relatives and friends cannot visit, we have adapted to laptops and the website, sharing information and photographs. Our thanks go to all the dedicated people who are helping us as well as those who are supporting our fund-raising efforts and making generous donations for residents and staff – not to mention the supplies delivered by contractors and emergency services'. So here's a big shout out to Avening's **Barbara Parker, Debra Brownsall, Hayley Marciniak** and **Christine Howell** who are part of Horsfalls' dedicated team and – of course – some of the heroes we clap for on Thursdays!

**Beverley Rymer** and **Phoebe Carter** will be completing some preliminary work for the area at the top of the playing field this weekend which will eventually become a community orchard. Brambles will be cleared from around the existing fruit trees, paying especially attention to nesting birds and other wildlife.

Parish Councillor **John Hetterley** is cheerleader-in-chief for a Crowdfunder Project seeking funding for a new zipwire for the Play Park. Calor Gas is working with Crowdfunder and will use the level of public support to decide which projects go forward to final judging, potentially winning grants worth up to £5000 from their Rural Community Fund. This will be done on a points system: one point for a 'like' or 'share' and 10 points for each pledge (but note that each user may only support a project once). ## The Lockdown Lowdown

Each week we compile a handy list which will make life under lockdown a bit easier

### This week: A Load of Old Rubbish

*It's been a big week this week. Not only were our green bins collected on Thursday morning (and full again by Thursday evening), but we also had news that the Horsley tip was re-opening (for booked slots only) on Tuesday. Because you can't learn much about local recycling bins from online sources, we also took a tour of various car parks and pull-ins to see what was still being collected. The things we do for the Lowdown....!*

#### Rubbish and recycling in Avening

First, a shout-out to our bin men, who have stuck with it over the past nine weeks, shifting an extra 330 tonnes of rubbish during lockdown in the Cotswold District Council area alone. All your weekly rubbish questions (or rather, questions about weekly rubbish) are answered on <https://www.cotswold.gov.uk/bins-and-recycling/> as well as listing roads missed during the weekly collections. Bulky item collection is running as usual – call 01285 623123

The Terracycle recycling boxes for crisp packets and toothbrushes and toothpaste packaging which used to be at the School (supported by collections at the Café) are no longer available. Common sense suggests it is unlikely that toothbrushes will be recycled any time soon. It is worth keeping crisp packets if you can, for recycling once collections resume.

### **Household Waste Recycling Centres In Gloucestershire**

Details are available on: <https://www.gloucestershirerecycles.com/household-recycling-centres-hrcs/> You now have to book for almost all HWRCs, so do check before you load up – and you have to be quick if you want to bag a slot anytime soon!

### **Nearby recycling bins (information accurate as of 21<sup>st</sup> May)**

- Most clothes recycling bins are closed. This includes the Salvation Army and other bins in Tesco, Tetbury and the clothes and textile recycling bins next to Tesco in Nailsworth. The clothes and shoes bin at the junction of Spring Hill and Northfield Road is open.
- The disposable cups and coated-cardboard milk and soup carton recycling bin is open at Tesco in Tetbury. All other bins there are closed.
- The Stroud Valley's Project has suspended its packaging recycling projects.

### **Returning medicines**

Lloyds Pharmacy in Nailsworth started taking unused medicines again last week.

### **Minimising waste in the first place!**

A hearty cheer for **The Grocer on Church Street** who gave us flour when there was none! You can take any container and fill-up on a range of dry goods as well as things like detergent and milk from Woefulane Dairy. They also stock bamboo toothbrushes. We had a chance to catch up with **Shiny Goodness** owner Gail on Friday. The shop is now open in its new location on, George St in Nailsworth with more space, a bigger range of detergents for refills, a growing range of dry goods and they also stock Woefulane milk. Because they have been refitting the shop during lockdown, they have been able to build in some really good social distancing features: separate entrances and exits; a one-way system in the shop; and a protective screen at the cash till.
