

Avening and Cherington Churches



Dear friends,

August often feels like an in-between month. In our communities, we've just enjoyed the splendour of Cherington Show, a day when the whole village comes together and visitors flock from miles around. We're not quite at Pig Face Day yet — that uniquely Avening event that brings the community together to celebrate the completion of Holy Cross Church by recalling Queen Matilda's gift of a pig's head to the villagers. Schools are out, harvest (the next big event in the church's calendar) is still around the corner, and many people are heading off on their summer holidays. And in the church calendar we're in "ordinary time", between the celebrations of Easter, Ascension and Pentecost on one side and Harvest, Remembrance, and the buildup to Christmas on the other.

The Bible is full of in-between places. The Israelites wandered in the wilderness between Egypt and the Promised Land. Jesus spent forty quiet days in the desert before beginning his public ministry. Even the early Church waited between the resurrection and Pentecost, unsure of what would come next. These stretches of time, while not full of dramatic events, were still deeply formative. They were times to listen, to wait, and to prepare.

Sometimes, we overlook these quieter stretches of life. We mark our lives by milestones like weddings, births, retirements, achievements, or community events. But God often speaks most clearly in the spaces between such moments. In the stillness, the walking, the waiting.

I wonder what this August looks like for you. Maybe you're enjoying a much-needed rest. Maybe you're in the middle of something hard or uncertain. Maybe you're just ticking over quietly. Wherever you are, know that these in-between times are not wasted. They can be times of deep growth, if we let them be.

As a parish, we're in an in-between season, too – continuing to grow together as a benefice, learning each other's rhythms and traditions. I'm grateful for the quieter pace of August to reflect and pray – and to begin thinking about the seasons ahead.

So, whether you're away on holiday or staying put, I hope you find some space this month: to rest, to reflect, and to know that God is at work even – and especially – in the in-between.



District Councillor's Report



Cotswold District Council (CDC): has a new Chief Executive – Robert Weaver decided to step down from his role as chief executive officer, effective Monday, June 30, as he wanted to explore other opportunities and spend more time with his young family. At a special full council meeting on 26 June, following the recommendation of the appointment panel, Jane Portman was approved as the new CEO. Jane has almost 40-years of public service experience. She joins with particular and significant first-hand knowledge on leading councils through local government reorganisation, where she collaborated and led on programmes in Dorset and Somerset. This experience will be invaluable next year when CDC dissolves and becomes part of the proposed Gloucestershire Unitary Council.

Overview & Scrutiny (O&S): we will be treated to two O&S meetings on consecutive days in early July due to the cancellation of a previous meeting – I will report on these next time.

Cirencester Fire Station Roundabout Improvement Works: The roads will be closed overnight to allow for resurfacing and white lining from 7 to 18 July - 8pm to 6am. The works to improve the capacity of the roundabout and provide new pedestrian and cycle crossings on the Fire Station Roundabout are nearing completion. Traffic lights have been installed but will not be operational until completion. The foot and cycle crossing surfaces are being finalised, and the service access to the centre of the roundabout is nearing completion.

A417 missing link: Having passed the huge engineering project recently, it is obvious that good progress is being made. The focus is on the hill up to the old Air Balloon site – the steepness of the hill is being reduced to improve the traffic flow and reduce the number of lorries breaking down. If you would like to take a closer look, the Customer Hub, located at the crusher compound at Shab Hill, continues to open every Tuesday and Wednesday from 10am - 2pm. You can visit any time during these hours, without pre-booking an appointment. Members of the team will be on hand to and answer any questions that you may have. Letter from Chairman of Avening Parish Council



Just a reminder, should you for any reason be planning to attend the next monthly Avening Parish Meeting, the next meeting will be in September as we will have a Summer break for August. However individual Parish Councillors will still be available to provide assistance if required.

Without repeating last month's notes there is little to add that is new.

Playing Field: The zip wire has now been repaired and serviced, just in time for the school holidays. The repairs reflected the amount of use the zip wire has had since it was installed. We hope that it will continue to provide fun for the children (and Adults) for many more years.

Parking on Pavements: Worth mentioning a second time. Please be aware of the problems caused to pedestrians when parking on pavements. Please make sure that there is sufficient room on the pavement for a wheelchair or pram to pass by safely.

Visit by our local MP: MP Roz Savage will be visiting Avening Café on 29th July from 10am − 12 noon. She will give a resume of her first year in office and be available for questions.

Memorial Hall: By the time that you read this article, work will have commenced (at last!) on the reroofing of the hall. Scheduled to be completed by September, subject to any unforeseen delays.

Old Quarries Development: There have been one or two concerns raised over some disruptions to traffic caused by delivery and other construction vehicles accessing the Old Quarries site. Councillor Richard King and myself visited the site to find out first hand what stage the works have reached. We had a very cordial meeting with the site manager, Adrian Cordy. The project will be ongoing for approximately 2 years and the construction traffic will diminish as the project progresses. Adrian is very conscious of minimising any impact on Avening and villagers. 

A huge thank you to everyone who attended our AGM on Wednesday 9th July. There was so much energy and enthusiasm from all who attended and so much to discuss. We looked at what had been done this past year which included increasing staff numbers, increasing fundraising and reducing overall monthly costs. Although, numbers are low for September we really want the playgroup to grow, so we will be using this time for training, updating processes and working on marketing the playgroup. We had to unfortunately say goodbye to our Treasurer Rhiannon, who has worked tirelessly to secure grants and donations — thank you so much for all you have done for the playgroup, we will miss you! This meant that we had to vote in a new member of the committee and we welcome Charlie Keen who has taken on the role of Secretary. Lydia is staying on as Chair and Kate also is staying on and has taken the role of Treasurer. Thank you to all of you. The playgroup is always looking for more members, so if you are interested, please contact us.

We have decided to increase the length of our sessions from September so will now be open 9 am - 3 pm, with a focus on each day:

Musical Mondays 9am – 3pm Adventure Tuesdays 9am – 3pm Wise Owl Wednesdays 9am – 3pm

During the summer holidays we will be running a Stay & Play session on Thursdays between 9.30 and 11.00 am. The cost is £3 per child and £1.50 for an additional child. The children will be provided with a drink and a snack, and there will be hot drinks available for adults to purchase. If this is popular, we will continue it during term time. Hope to see you there!

Over the last few weeks, we have been looking at the life cycles of frogs and butterflies, been practising running races for the playgroup race at the Avening Primary School sports day and we have looked at summer and what we associate with it. The children have had lots of outside play both in the playground and in the covered area when the sun has been really hot! They had picnics by the climbing frame, looked after their babies in the wooded area and made dinner in the mud kitchen!




