
## **Avening Fete**


## **Avening Fete**

I think all of us that attended felt the pleasure and joy of meeting our neighbours in a fun environment. Congratulations to the ingenuity shown by the now famous Duck Race; a small dam and a leaf blower compensated for the lack of water and current, both of which had been sadly lacking in the days running up to the Fete.

#### Avening Village Awards – 2021

I had the pleasure of awarding the winners of the various categories in the Avening Village Awards with their certificates and prizes. The recent Covid lockdown had seen many villagers demonstrate what good neighbours and community minded people we are lucky to live amongst. The competition was fierce, but the results were: -

#### Villager of the Year – Junior Category (Two Winners)

**Elsie Hawker:** For helping to keep the school garden beautiful and contributing to the Community Orchard Design

Joe Hawker: For helping to keep the school garden beautiful and being selected as a Forest Green Rovers ambassador

### Villager of the Year – Student Category

**Ellie Sanders:** For giving up her time to help run free dance classes over Zoom and writing a regular column in the Buzz newsletter

### Villager of the Year – Adult Category

**Mike Metcalfe:** For giving up his time to help with the school garden, cleaning the churchyard, helping his neighbours and sharing his hobby of rug making and generally embracing Avening village life.

### Avening Village – Special Community Award

**Jennie South:** For being instrumental in starting the Community Café and working tirelessly during the pandemic to keep the café spirit alive bringing the community together.

The results of the voting are collated on the evening prior to the event so we have to rely on the winners being in attendance. All went well except that Elsie and Joe didn't hear the announcements over the tannoy system – but I have managed to catch up with them since and hand over their prizes of an Amazon gift voucher each. Two delightful children who are a real credit to the village. Unfortunately, Mike Metcalfe was in hospital on the day – but I have made arrangements to present him with his engraved Wine Glass at the next Community Café morning. Very well done Mike, thoroughly deserved.

#### Avening Memorial Hall

Good news on this front, the Charities Commission have at long last approved the list of the new Trustees; which comprises all the Parish Council members together with the addition of Bob Scurfield who heads up the Hall Management Committee. This enables various outstanding issues such as maintenance and redecoration to be addressed, in what is coincidentally the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the hall.

#### Roads

Always seem to be on the radar in some way or another. Anyone driving into Avening from the Nailsworth direction will have noticed that as you exit the last part of the 'S' bend, the white lines and cats' eyes are not exactly in the middle of the road, with the result that if you stay to the left of the lines there is a real likelihood that you will strike the curb – I have notified Highways of the problem and they have promised to get the contractors back to address the issue. Maybe by the time the magazine is published it will have been sorted.

**Footnote** – Who won the first prize of £150 in the Church Fete Raffle? – yes it was me! The first raffle I'd won in years. Caught me by complete surprise as I'd bought the tickets quickly without looking at the prizes. However, as seems appropriate I will donate the money in some way to the benefit of the village.



## **Paul Howell** 13/11/1950- 8/9/2021

The following is taken from the address given at the cremation service of Paul Graham Howell which took place at the North Wiltshire crematorium on 20<sup>th</sup> September.



Paul was the youngest of eight children born to Katie Adela and Fred Howell. He was born on the 13<sup>th</sup> November 1950 in Sunnyside Maternity hospital, Cheltenham. The family lived in Standish near Stonehouse; from there they moved to The Hut at Lark Hill, Long Newnton, where Fred worked on a farm. From there they moved on to Silver Street in Tetbury and then on to Romney Road, again in Tetbury.

Paul went to Primary school in Long Newnton and then was supposed to attend Sir William Romney secondary school in Tetbury, but I am told that he would find any excuse not to turn up at school. One of his favorite means of escape was to wear his jeans to school, especially on Tetbury market day. At registration, of course the teacher would send him home because jeans were not school uniform and not allowed in school, so Paul

promptly shot off to the market to see the cattle being sold.

Paul left school aged 15, and worked at Witchell's Farm, then Mr J. Benton then among others Blanches, Bray's before returning to Benton's. He also worked for Tetbury Steel.

Paul took early retirement (if you can call it that) because he then started farming on his own with a flock of ewes which he kept, with his son Graham, in some fields on Hyde Hill, a short distance from his home in Avening. Both Father and son enjoyed working with their own sheep.

Paul met his wife, Christine whilst playing skittles for the Long Newnton Larks and after about 18 months they married on 9<sup>th</sup> June 1979. Their son John was born on 7<sup>th</sup> March 1980 and Graham was born on 14<sup>th</sup> July 1983.

Chris and Paul enjoyed their holidays camping at Brean with the boys and on the journey they would always listen to Paul's favorite Country and Western music. They also enjoyed many other holidays both in the UK and abroad.

For the last 6 years the absolute light of Paul and Chris' life has been their granddaughter, Briley.

Oct 26<sup>th</sup> "CREATIVE WRITING" – with Atlanta Rayner in the quiet room from 9:30am (£5 for one hour session).





It has been lovely having the children back at the playgroup and welcoming the new families to the setting. It is still early days but they are all settling in well and becoming familiar with the playgroup routine.

The topics we have looked at so far have concentrated on 'ourselves' and 'feelings'. We have been:

- Describing ourselves and our friends
- Talking about our interests and what we are good at
- Drawing ourselves
- Painting ourselves step by step
- Making paper plate faces
- Looking at the feelings chart and talking about how the person is feeling



The children have also enjoyed meeting 'Beat Baby' – a small cuddly toy. We have a book of rhymes that we use when Beat Baby comes out and we clap our hands when singing them. This helps the children to establish and maintain a steady beat which in turn can support the development of both gross and fine motor skills. 

## Prisons Week, 10 to 16 October.

#### What does the Church do to help prisoners and those released from prison?

Prisons Week is when Christians join in prayer for all prisons and prisoners. As Anglican Bishop for HM Prisons in England and Wales and a member of the All-Parliamentary Group on Women in the Penal System, Bishop Rachel (the Bishop of Gloucester) supports chaplains in prisons, as well as developing relationships and being involved with people and issues across the breadth of the Criminal Justice System.

She heads up a Prison Team and is also a Patron of both the Prison Fellowship, and The Welcome Directory and the President of the Nelson Trust and an Ambassador for the Christian charity Restored. Bishop Rachel leads a campaign called Fighting for Women's Justice and believes the women's justice system needs to change. It costs approximately £47k per year to keep a woman in prison, but Women's Centres can provide a holistic trauma-informed approach of rehabilitation for about £4k a year, with much research showing this is the most effective way to stop reoffending. On release from prison, many women find it difficult to secure suitable accommodation for themselves with their children and so the whole family suffers. Bishop Rachel uses her voice in the House of Lords to speak out for the transfer of more funds to holistic rehabilitation schemes like Women's Centres, rather than keeping women in prison.

The Welcome Directory lists faith communities who are willing to be a place of welcome and support for people leaving prison. When people are well supported in their new community they are less likely to reoffend. Might Avening be able to provide some support? For more information contact admin@welcomedirectory.org.uk.

As an example of this, here is an outline of the experience of another Rachel. Rachel served a sentence at Eastwood Park Prison and told her story in the House of Commons at an event to highlight the importance of finding suitable accommodation for women released from prison. She said, "I tried to escape from my abusive partner, who was dealing drugs many times but had never been able to get away. I found that if I did as I was told, the beatings happened less often." Rachel was drawn into her partner's drug dealing. "I got arrested and ended up on a conspiracy to supply class A drugs charge. I got sentenced to four years in custody and was going to be away from everything I knew for two years. I was scared, I was terrified. My daughter had to go and live with my parents – I know I'm very lucky to have had them. In Eastwood Park, I met Jo from The Nelson Trust Women's Centre and built a relationship with her. She would come and see me every week and I felt I had someone to talk to and share my experiences with. I got on with my sentence and counted down the days till I could be with my daughter again. Throughout my whole time away, I was concerned about my release – how was I going to get a home for me and my daughter? I wanted my life to be back to normal again." Rachel was able to get a home, which the Diocese of Gloucester provided through The Nelson Trust Project Reunite Gloucestershire, to rebuild her relationship with her daughter and finally be a mum. She now has a job, a strong relationship with her daughter and a foster daughter. See her full story at <u>https://youtu.be/qy8WS3KF0Uc</u>.



## **Church Details** The South Door of the Church.



Originally, there was a South door into Avening church, as well as a North door. Can you imagine strolling down the footpath from Church Farm to enter the church through that South door?

Then, in the 1700s there was a West Door, the South door having been blocked up, and buttresses added outside the church wall there. You can still see some of the stonework for that door, inside and outside the church. Eventually, the West door, too, was blocked up and a window inserted above it.

In the early 20th century, stained glass windows were inserted on the south side of the nave, two by Christopher Whall and one (in the middle) by Edward Payne, both leading artists in the Arts and Crafts Movement.

## **Nailsworth Mills Bowls Club Wins!**



Congratulations to Nailsworth Mills Bowling Club on winning the Bowls Challenge Cup in a match at G. B. Britton Bowls Club in Bristol on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2021. Since 1929 this annual has taken tournament place between Nailsworth Mills Bowling Club and G.B. Britton Bowls Club. The Challenge Cup came about through trading activities between E. A. Chamberlain and G. B. Britton, each taking it in

turns to host the fixture. G.B. Britton, a Bristolian company established in 1876, were contracted to supply British military footwear and E. A. Chamberlain supplied them with nylon mesh insoles for their boots. In the late 1940s and early 1950s Chamberlains used to bring ex-prisoners of war and displaced war refugees by lorry from Babdown Aerodrome (a refugee camp at the time) and many Polish, Italian and German nationals worked in the factory. Both E.A Chamberlain and G.B.Britton had lawn bowls greens for their employees' use and Chamberlain's family were responsible for creating The Nailsworth Mills Bowls Club on the Nailsworth Mills Estate on the Avening Road.

There are now 12 residents of Avening who are active members of this progressive playing and social club and the annual presentation awards this year are held in the Avening Social Club with supper supplied by the Avening W.I.
