# Letter From Avening Parish



At the time of writing this article, the war in Ukraine continues, with devastating loss of life and suffering imposed on its people. We are a small village in a beautiful part of the Cotswolds which could not seem further away from the realities of war; but on behalf of the village I would send our prayers and hopes for peace to the people of Ukraine.

Historically, Avening has also seen its share of suffering through war. This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Memorial Hall, built to commemorate local young men from Avening and Nags Head who gave their lives in the two World Wars – a total casualty list of 59 men; 48 from Avening and eleven from Nags Head. The Trustees have plans to carry out repairs and refurbishments to the building which hopefully will be the foundation of its existence for the next one hundred years. However we need two things. As always, one of them is money; our funds are lower than our expected expenses – so any contributions and fund-raising would be most welcome. The second is suggestions as to how the village would like to celebrate this centenary year – please contact the Parish Clerk on the website with your ideas.

With the Queen's Jubilee celebrations in mind – just a reminder that as a village we are still seeking suggestions from the community. It is worth noting that if this involves road closures, it may well involve a fee and probably a notice period of at least one month.

Road Issues – The County Council have unfortunately refused to fund/give an additional Grit Bin for the Sunground. They claim budget white lines and cats eyes on the Nailsworth road as you exit Avening are still pending. I have sent a reminder to Highways and received an acknowledgement that the issues will be dealt with.

Just a reminder that we would welcome the addition of one extra Parish Councillor onto the committee; so if you are interested and would like to discuss it further then please give me a call.

This month it is the turn of **Christine Howell** to present her profile as one of the serving Parish councillors:-

I have lived in Avening for 40 years, moving here with my husband Paul and my eldest son John who was two at that time; my second son Graham came along 18 months later. I have run a pensioner lunch and helped at the café, big breakfast and other charitable events in the village. I have just retired as chef at Horsefall House and have time to be a proud grandmother to my granddaughter Briley Marie Spice Howell.

I have served on the Parish Council for four years and hope to continue to serve the village for as long as I am able.

Finally, a big welcome to Jo and James at the The Matilda which is now open again for business; it's good to have an additional social focal point in the village and I wish them every success.



# **Church Detail**



To enter Avening's Norman church, you will first pass through a porch built in the early 14th century. About 100 years later, a floor above was constructed with access from the outside of the porch. This upper room would have been used by the parish priest. The upstairs floor would have hidden the top of the energetically carved Norman doorway into the church. In the 16th century a lower, Perpendicular, stone doorway was inserted into the original door. Now, with the upper floor removed, we pass through the 'new' doorway without a thought for the original chevron-carved arch and the richly decorated columns above us.



# **Down Memory Lane**

## A New Beginning

In the autumn of 1955, my Stewart family moved from Brockworth to Avening.

There were six of us then. Alf Stewart (Pop); Peggy Stewart (Mother); Niel Stewart (13 years); Kevin Stewart (me, 9 years); Karen Stewart (5 years); and Martin Stewart (2 years).

The plan was that we should have a more fulfilling life in the country and to some extent it did work out that way. My parents had secured the lease for the property known as The Gardens at Avening Court. This comprised of the old walled garden, a four bedroomed cottage, three very large greenhouses and a tennis court. All this for £80.00 per annum.

Pop continued to work nights at Gloucester Aircraft, and in the garden during the day. This probably contributed to the first of several strokes which eventually led to his death at the age of 57.

The village was a very different place then, everything the family needed was available without going to town.

Starting at the bottom of the village; Dennis Tufley at the police station, Boulton's coal yard and Pike House garage. The School, the church, Mr Soper's Cotswold Stores, Marshall May's Bakery, The Co-op, the Post Office, Mrs Fletcher's shop on the Cross and not forgetting enough pubs for a small town.

During the holidays I got to know the Powell family at Court Farm. Fred, Archie, Gerald and Gaye made me welcome, and soon put me to work putting the tops on milk bottles. It amazed me how much effort went into producing the milk which arrived on our doorsteps.

As soon as we arrived in the village, I started at the village school. This was quite a culture shock for me! I had attended a brand new school at Brockworth where the toilets were made of porcelain and flushed. Wooden seats with buckets underneath came as a bit of a shock. Very soon a new toilet block was built at the back of the school. School dinners came from a central kitchen at Gloucester. We knew when they had arrived because the whole school smelt of cabbage!

Peter Smith was the Head Teacher. The school was well run but the standard of teaching was barely adequate. When I started at secondary school in Tetbury it was soon apparent that the children who attended primary school at Tetbury or Chipping Sodbury had a head start on the children from Avening.

Recently I have been catching up on Avening life by reading the village magazine online. One article in particular grabbed my attention, the re-opening of the kitchen (October 2019). I was there when the original kitchen was opened in 1956. Mrs. Hedges and Mrs. Sparrow provided us with wonderful dinners, and on opening day we feasted on pigs in blankets, baked beans and mashed potatoes. The smell of

Years later I met Peter Smith at the Ragged Cot, he seemed much nicer then, after a couple of pints of beer!

As Pop's health deteriorated, he took a job at Chamberlains in the office next to the bowling green. Sometimes, when Jack and Betty Herbert took a holiday, my parents looked after the Nags Head for them. Eventually when they moved to the Bell and Castle in Horsley we moved into the pub. In those days

landlords were allowed to have another job, this took some pressure off Pop but after another stroke Mother went to work at Amberley Post Office and Pop looked after the Pub.

During the morning, we were entertained and exercised in equal measure by Dan The Skipping Man and his assistant Jack who ran skipping sessions with each class and then concluded the morning with a skipping assembly with the whole school.



As well as plenty of fun inside the school, the children have been out and about lately

with the Hawks (y3/4) paying a visit to Slimbridge as part of their topic on 'Rivers' and the Eagles class (yr/1) travelling to Birdland for a dinosaur talk and some fossil digging.

Looking forward, we have plenty of exciting events coming up, with the Avening Talent Show making a much-anticipated return just before the Easter holidays. The acts that have signed up so far include: harpists, gymnastics, dance and singing. We will also have the annual Easter Egg Hunt on the last day of term.

Mental Health and Well-being are an integral focus of our school and we are proud to have been recently selected to become a Trailblazer School, supporting children with mental health needs.







No. You can still be a full and active member of the Church without joining the Roll, but it can provide a sense of belonging and identity with your church.



As it is quite small, it is perfect for groups that do not need to pay for a large room. The committee have worked very hard and updated the kitchen purchasing the basics (coffee machine, dish washer, refrigerator, and microwave,) for use when renting. There is also a new door, which now makes the Hall accessible for all. The Parish Council have agreed to a request from the Village Hall Trustees to help pay for the door, as the Hall is of benefit to all residents.

The next important date is Saturday the 21<sup>st</sup> of May when we will have the Annual Parish Meeting for all residents. The next Parish Council meeting is Tuesday 5th April.


