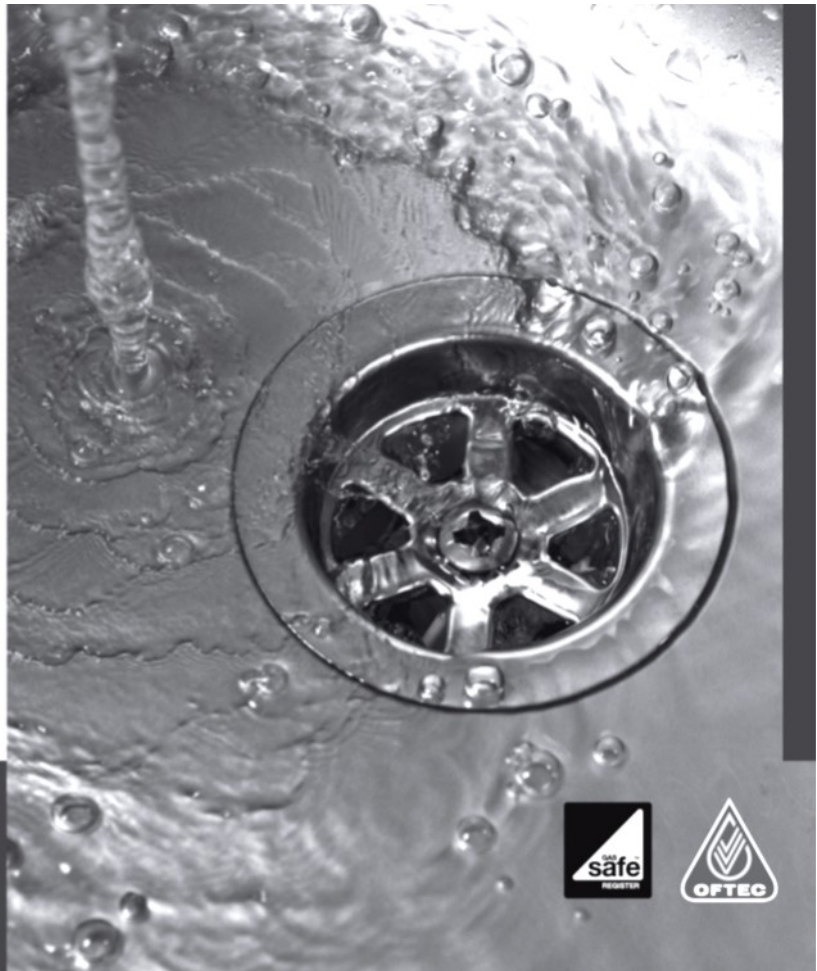

Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



The war in Ukraine remains foremost in our minds as it continues to increase in intensity and suffering. There a number of villagers who have put their names forward to host some of the refugees; they are yet to arrive but hopefully will be with us in the village as soon as possible. I'm guessing that there are more villagers who would like to take in refugees but do not have the capacity in their homes. With this in mind; can I suggest that anyone who can do so, gives peripheral support to the families who are hosting. This will both add to the welcome that the village offers as well as relieving the day to day pressure on the host families over what is likely to be a long period. Offers of transport, a trip out, invite them for a meal etc – there are many ways we can collectively rally round and give that extra welcome and support. However, I think we need to be careful in so much that we help in a manner that maintains strict security – so no social media platforms used; lets rely on word of mouth only, to maintain the safety and confidentiality of our visitors. I'm happy to respond to telephone calls for anyone who wants to be put in touch. Similarly, the Tuesday Café can be used a forum for contacts.

Visitors to the playing field will have noticed that a children's slide has been put in – it's actually a wide slide so that it can accommodate both a parent and toddler at the same time (don't feel embarrassed if you fancy a go all by yourself!) There is also a small roundabout on its way as well – presently somewhere on the high seas from a foreign land – but should be with us in the next few weeks.

You also may notice that there are two small trees planted adjacent to the toddler area – these are two Oak trees planted to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee year. It will be a generation or two before anyone will be able to enjoy sitting under them – but we have to start somewhere.

If you are one of the motorists who have had to take evasive action on the road from Avening to Nailsworth you will be relieved to know that 'a man from Highways' has looked at the situation and has assured me that he will move the relevant white lines and cats eyes to the centre of the road.



This month it's the turn of Cllr John Hetterley to profile himself; over to you John: -

I was a Civil Servant for over 40 years, working in Bath, London, Germany, Weymouth and Bristol. I retired around 10 years ago and have lived in Avening for the last 5 years with my wife Sandra. We have two children living fairly locally. Sandra and I helped set up the Avening Community Café along with Jennie South, Clare

Bebbington and others over 3 years ago and have made many new friends as a result. I enjoy attending the weekly Art group with Mark Kelland which grew out of a café initiative. I was asked to join the Parish Council in 2019 and led two crowdfunding campaigns for a new zip wire during 2020/21. This proved so successful that the PC has now provided a new zip wire, slide, picnic benches and we have allocated funds for a small roundabout. I also oversee and review the PC budget and expenditure within the finance sub-committee; we allocate funds for community projects as well as day to day running expenses and maintenance – so let me know if you have particular issues you think need to be catered for .

A hint of Summer is in the air so I hope that we can all enjoy returning to better days ahead.

We were fortunate on Easter Sunday to have Revd. Guy Treweek to take the morning Eucharist and lead us in joyful celebration. Easter is always a wonderful season, and this year is no exception.

May Day, on the first day of May, sends us into the month in a holiday spirit. Then it is only 3 weeks until the half term holiday! In fact, the holiday at the end of May used to be called the Whitsun holiday, named for the white clothes worn by those newly baptised on the celebration of Pentecost. The feast of Pentecost recalls the arrival of the Holy Spirit to the apostles after the death of Jesus. Whit can also be interpreted as 'wit' or understanding. Pentecost is 40 days after Easter, and Easter changes date from year to year, so now we have a 'Public Holiday' to end the month instead. Whitsun this year is on June 5th.

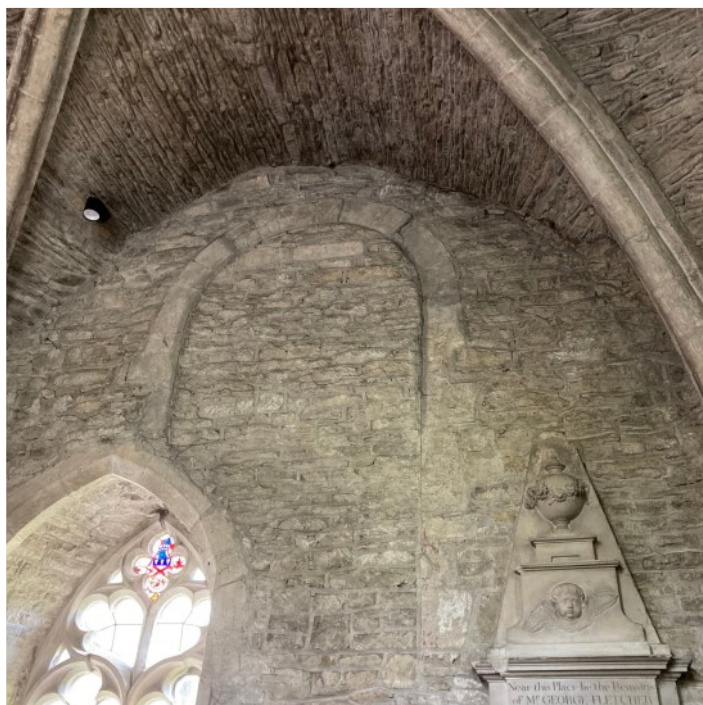

Church Detail



If you stand at the gates to the churchyard looking up at the church you will notice a small, blocked-up window towards the East end of the church. During the 13th and 14th centuries, many of our church windows were made larger or more decorative as technology and funds allowed. This small window is one of the original Norman windows, and there are later windows either side of it. When you go into the church there is no sign of that skinny window by the altar. What is there is a Norman arch over a surprisingly large blocked-up window, not skinny at all. It would have let in significant light. The reason is that the 'reveals' at the sides of the skinny window slant away from the window, and because the walls are very thick the resulting shape is much wider on the inside than on the outside.

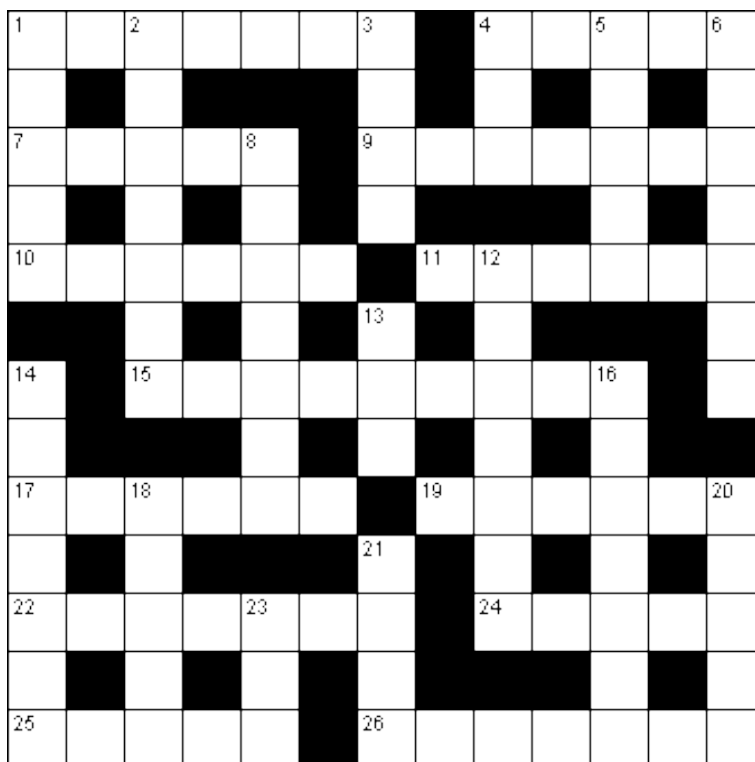

Dancing at the Vatican

On 8th April, Avening Memorial Hall was the venue for a special screening to villagers of a short film called Dancing At The Vatican. The film was written and narrated by Avening resident and former TV reporter and war correspondent, Charles Sabine OBE, who kindly hosted the screening. It tells the story of the incredibly brave journey undertaken by dozens of South American sufferers of Huntington's Disease in 2017 to an audience at the Vatican with Pope Francis.

Huntington's Disease is a fatal genetic brain disorder affecting nearly 1 million people globally and is found especially concentrated in pockets of South America. The disease has been stigmatised for many years and Charles, who comes from a family with Huntington's Disease, is a co-founder of a movement called Hidden No More, which has campaigned tirelessly to raise public awareness of the condition. History was made at the audience with the Pope, who would become the first global leader to ever publicly recognise the disease

and speak the words 'Huntington's Disease' aloud.

The film, which includes local footage of Charles in countryside near his home in Avening, focusses on the emotional journey taken by the sufferers of the disease, culminating in their joy at meeting the Pope as they celebrated by uninhibitedly dancing in the revered cloisters of the Vatican. It is an intensely moving documentary which left many with moist eyes in the audience at the Memorial Hall. The undoubted star of the movie is a charismatic young girl called Brenda from Buenos Aires, who suffers with HD but who has been sponsored and supported remotely by the generosity of Avening villagers, led by Archie Hardman.

We also had some very positive feedback about the longer trail where you had to look for teddy bears and find different letters from their names to form the name of a rhyme. Many of you also commented that the route for the teddy bears trail revealed some beautiful views and houses which some of you were not aware of.

Easter- as well as the Easter egg hunt that the committee organised as a fundraiser, we had our own little Easter egg hunt on the final day of term. The children were also busy making Easter cards, decorations and face masks.

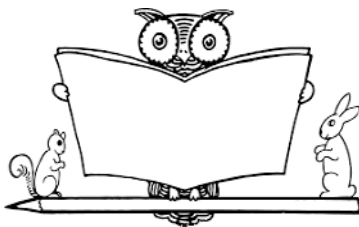

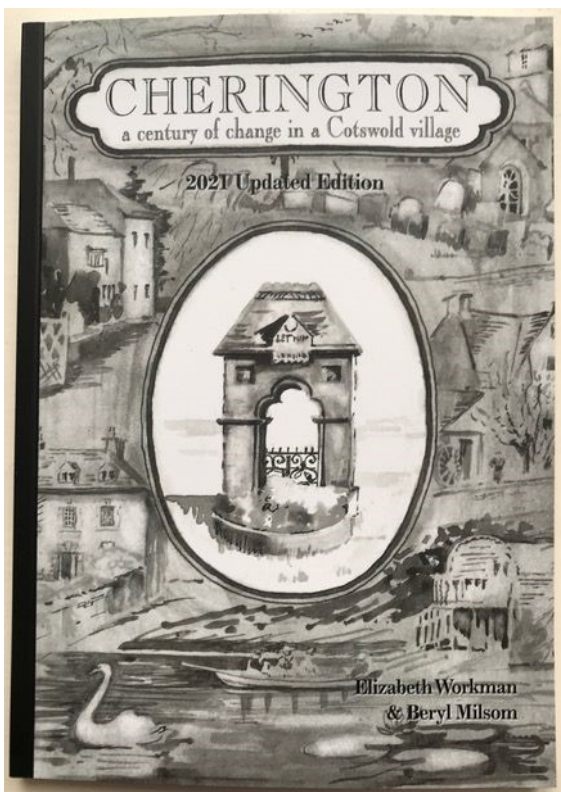

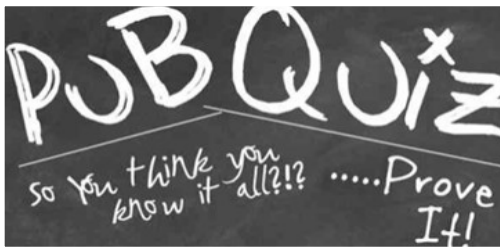
