I would to start by passing on the thanks from the Parish Council to all those who made the Ukrainian evening such a great success. It was a wonderful example of friendship and community spirit of which everyone should be proud. I know that Maryna, Oleksa and Ivanka feel at home here in Avening and thank everyone for helping and making them welcome. Their appreciation and thanks also go to the two schools in which they have been made very welcome – Avening Primary and Sir William Romney Schools.

**Memorial Hall** – Work has now started on redecorating the interior: bright and light is the order of the day. In addition, the electrics are being updated which will include new meters and if possible new improved LED lights in the ceiling of the main hall, making it brighter and more energy efficient.

**Playing Field** – You may have noticed (difficult to miss!) a trench being dug across the top of the field; this is to allow a new electricity cable to run from Steps Lane to the substation at the Sunground. As part of this work we will be able to install the promised electric point at the top of the playing area which will facilitate supply for any future events in the field that require electricity. We also plan to replace the main entrance gate which has fallen victim to ageing and put in a pedestrian gate at the entrance nearest to the school. The pedestrian gate will hopefully be a deterrent to young children and dogs running out onto the road.

Roads Issues are virtually a fixture in the Parish Councils agenda. Potholes and white lines that need to be moved are still on Highways 'to do list'. It seems that the Highways department is not going to trim the grass verges this year so as to save money; so good luck negotiating corners where the roads will become narrower. Highways will be spending money on some road resurfacing in the coming weeks; those of you with a keen eye will have seen some markings on the main roads (Hampton Hill and Tetbury Hill). These denote sizeable stretches earmarked for resurfacing. These are sections of the road that are normally considered good enough for locals and local cyclists who actually contribute towards road maintenance. Nothing wrong with that I hear you say! – except that this resurfacing is deemed necessary because a leg of the Tour of Britain cycle race will be passing through in early September - for maybe 60 seconds. Maybe it's me, but I can't balance the aforementioned cost savings against the extravagance of this resurfacing. If there is a next time, let's push to have the race routed around the village a few times and have all the roads resurfaced. Being serious for a moment; I wish the riders a safe journey and hope they manage to navigate the many potholes that us locals have become skilled in avoiding.

**Planning** – there is a general delay with planning at present due to legislation introduced in 2019 to cover the preservation and avoid pollution that may affect

Beech Forests in England. Any planning application within 15.2 kilometres of a Beech Forest is required to show how it will negate the impact on the forest caused by additional population and traffic etc. There is some proposal that a cash donation to CDC will cover this element; but this is yet to be finalised. If you are considering any build project that needs planning approval, I would suggest you Google Beech Trees to get the full picture. Worth noting that the nearest Beech Forest to Avening is at Cranham; unfortunately, its within 15.2 Km as the crow flies to Avening.







# **AVENING COMMUNITY HEARTBEAT DEFIBRILLATOR**

(in the village phone box outside the Old Bakery

DANGER	Ensure you and the casualty are safe. If not <u>Call 999</u>
RESPONSE	Speak to the Casualty in both ears, Tap the collar bones. Do not shake the person !
SHOUT	Shout for Help If the Casualty does not respond <u>do not</u> leave them at this stage. <u>Call 999</u> now. Ambulance control will advise if the defibrillator is needed.
AIRWAY	Ensure airway is open and clear. Open the airway by lifting the chin and tilting the head back
BREATHING	Listen & look for breathing sounds and movement. If the casualty is not breathing or you have any doubt <u>Call 999</u>
<u>CPR</u>	Place your hands in centre of the Casualty's chest and press down hard. Just do compressions. If confident give breaths as well. 2 breaths every 30 compressions.
DEFIBRILLATION	Do not leave the casualty alone. Continue with CPR and wait for help and the ambulance. If someone is available ambulance control will give you the access code to the defibrillator. Turn on the defibrillator which will give you clear instructions to follow




