Letter from Chairman of Avening Parish Council



This month's Parish Meeting covered mostly routine items as you can see from the report elsewhere in the Villager.

Two main items to highlight: -

The Memorial Hall: By the time this month's Villager comes to print you may notice that some building work has begun on the Memorial Hall.

The Hall is now over one hundred years old, and like all buildings of that age and size, it requires continual love and care to maintain it as a place that is both safe and pleasant to use. Finance, or lack of it, dictates how and when remedial work can be carried out. Fortunately, the Trustees have accumulated some funds to start the process. The first phase of improvements was the installation of the new heating system and some electrical rewiring. The second phase of repairs is concentrated on the entrance gable end. This needs reroofing together with the refurbishment of the two toilet areas; the result should bring the interior up to more modern and acceptable standards. The next phase is likely to be the replacement of the north side of the main roof with new tiles to replace the existing ones.

These phases are just two examples of the ongoing work that will need to be planned and budgeted for over the coming years. The kitchen in the Chamberlain Room is also on the agenda to be refurbished; and in the long term, it is likely that at some stage the hall floor will need to be upgraded. All of these improvements require that the hall is run as a viable commercial proposition, both to fund the necessary work already identified, and in the long term, accumulate a fighting fund to cover ongoing upkeep and any unexpected emergencies. We anticipate that the overall expenditure could be in the hundreds of thousands to achieve all of the above. Worth mentioning is the fact that, due to its charitable status, the Memorial Hall cannot take out loans or mortgages to finance costs, and therefore has to be self-sufficient, or rely on donations or grants for additional financial help.

Local Policing: There have been a few incidents where cars have been parked on pavements in a fashion that has completely blocked pavements, making it necessary for parents with children coming from school to step onto the main road. Regrettably when we reported some of these incidents to the police, they were unable to respond due to lack of personnel and because other incidents were considered to be of a higher priority. It is a reflection of how our rural policing is taking second place to those areas with a higher population density. Also, while I'm on the subject of pavements; if for some reason you have to park on part of the pavement, please make an effort to leave at least a sensible gap and allow for buggies or wheelchair users. If your hedges are overhanging the pavement and contributing to this problem - please trim them back sufficiently to anticipate next year's growth repeating the problem.

Last but not least, we have an upcoming vacancy on the Parish Council – so if you are interested and feel that you would like to make a contribution to the future of the village, please get in touch with me or contact the Parish Clerk.

Summer appears to have arrived, maybe not every day, but when the sun shines it makes us all feel a bit better; here's hoping that the weather stays bright for the holiday period for us all to enjoy.



The Kemble Station Mystery

We're very fortunate to have a railway station so close to us, but why on earth did it end up at Kemble, in the middle of nowhere?

I've done some research, and from what I've found I can imagine a conversation between Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Robert Gordon in about 1836:



Brunel: "Mr Gordon, I'm drawing up plans for a Great Western Railway line between Cirencester and London, and I'm prepared to pay you £250 per acre if you will permit me to run the line through your land".

Gordon: "I don't need your money, Mr Brunel, and the last thing I want is for a railway line to spoil our view from Kemble House".

Brunel: "I could build a covered section of the line, about 400 yards long, so that you won't see it. Incidentally, Mr Gordon, how long does it take you to reach your club in London?"

Gordon: "There's a regular stagecoach service, which takes two days".

Brunel: "I'll build you your own platform, and as long as you give us prior notice, the train will stop for you and transport you to London within two hours".

And so Kemble started out as a basic single platform, which by 1882 had the impressive Victorian Gothic stone building we see today, with the two platforms.

Whenever I take the train, it always brings to my mind Adlestrop, another rural Gloucestershire station, now long gone, a victim of Doctor Beeching's axe in the 1960s. There, during late June in 1914, an express train drew up 'unwontedly', and inspired 'Adlestrop', the famous poem by D H Thomas:

"The steam hissed. Someone cleared his throat.

No one left and no one came On the bare platform. All I saw Was Adlestrop - only the name."

If you want to be transported back to travel on the train on this hot summer's day, a hundred years' ago, then just listen to Geoffrey Palmer reciting the poem in full on YouTube. With Vaughan Williams' 'Lark Arising' playing in the background, it's the perfect evocation of England's countryside.

Alas, the other day I heard the unmistakable thud of a bird hitting one of my windows - a



sound which I dread hearing although, from time to time, if you can get to the bird quickly enough and it's just been stunned, it can sometimes be revived, calmed down and sent on its way. Alas, not so this time and, of course, it happened to be a thrush beyond reviving although I did stay with it for a time just in case. But no hope so I dug, as I always do, a little grave, buried it and sent it off to its heavenly rest.

That was bad enough until a few days later I saw my dog sniffing very interestedly at something and - sure enough - it was, of course, another thrush but this time it was just lying on the edge of a flower bed and in no way able to be revived. So, another burial alongside one of its kind - who knows

it might have been a brother or sister.

But back to the words of the song - the bright side of life returned a few days later when I heard the sound of shells being bashed on stone and, sure enough, there were three thrushes intent on getting the contents out of the shells and consuming a delicious snail supper.




